An Advisor's Reflection

My first time advising an HEO course in this way brought me some apprehension about how productive it would be. I hoped that the students who I advised would find the advising helpful and convenient. After my first session was complete, I felt such a sense of satisfaction. I think that being prepared in advance to address each student based on individual records, allowed me to problem-solve any issues quickly, and create an action plan for how the student can move forward on the academic pathway.

Some situations I helped to improve during our new advising pilot:

- A student on SEEK suspension was advised on SEEK reinstatement steps.
- A student, one math course away from graduating, was offered course options to help with successful completion.
- Students unaware of the ACHIEVE salary supplement award were provided with applications and instructions on how to apply.
