

# Articulation of Transfer Credit

## From Palm Beach State College to Troy University

---

This Articulation of Transfer Credit from Palm Beach State College to Troy University (TROY) identifies the terms and conditions required for the transfer of specific courses from PBSC to Troy University. Prospective TROY students from PBSC can be assured in advance of enrollment with TROY the specific courses from PBSC that will be accepted as fulfilling the requirements for the baccalaureate degree from TROY. Prospective TROY students must meet all TROY degree requirements, including TROY's General Studies requirements in order to be eligible to graduate from TROY. The attached transfer matrix is effective for a period of 2 years from the date it is signed by both parties subject to the terms and conditions detailed below.


1. Decisions made by regulatory agencies such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), the Alabama Department of Education, the Florida Board of Education, the Alabama Commission on Higher Education (ACHE), or special accrediting agencies may require changes be made to this agreement.
2. PBSC must retain its regional accreditation
3. The attached transfer matrix identifies PBSC courses acceptable to TROY.
4. Courses from PBSC must have a grade of "C" or higher to be considered for transfer to TROY according to the attached transfer matrix.
5. Transferability of CLEP, DANTES, advanced placement credit and/or other non-traditional credit is subject to approval by TROY.
6. Students from PBSC who wish to transfer to TROY must be in good standing at PBSC.
7. TROY defines a transfer student as one who has a minimum GPA of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) on at least 24 semester hours of college credit attempted excluding developmental courses. Those meeting this requirement may be admitted to TROY unconditionally.
8. Conditional admission may be granted to transfer students with a GPA of 1.7 to 1.99 (on a 4.0 scale).
  - a. Conditionally admitted transfer students will not be allowed to enroll in more than 13 hours per term until being admitted unconditionally and may be required to successfully complete one or more specific courses before being admitted unconditionally.
  - b. Conditionally admitted students must earn a GPA of 2.0 on the first 24 hours attempted at TROY. Those failing to meet this requirement will be dropped from the program and will not be allowed to continue until obtaining an overall GPA of 2.0 on all college work attempted, excluding developmental courses.
9. Prospective TROY students must be admitted to TROY before transfer credit will be awarded. Transfer credit will not be awarded until prospective TROY students
  - a. Meet eligibility requirements for admission to TROY
  - b. Complete and submit an Application for Admission
  - c. Pay the Admission Fee
  - d. Submit official transcripts and other required documents
10. All students must earn a minimum of 50% of all degree program hours on a senior college level in order to graduate from TROY with a bachelor's degree.

The attached transfer matrix involving TROY and Palm Beach State College courses will enable transfer students to have advanced information regarding guaranteed transferability.

Troy and PBSC will:

- Notify each other regarding any curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement.
- Agree to the cancellation of this agreement with 30 days prior notice from TROY or PBSC. In the case of cancellation, Palm Beach State students accepted to Troy but not yet enrolled will be covered by this agreement until they complete a bachelor's degree at TROY or terminate their enrollment at TROY (See Troy University Catalog for timeframe)
