New Course Effective January 2014

ENC1101L College Composition 1 Lab (1 credit, 2 lab hours, Prerequisite:Non-Exempt students will need to provide appropriate English placement scores and appropriate reading placement scores;

Corequisite: ENC1101, no special fees)

1 credit

Revised Course Effective January 2014

ENC1101 College Composition 1 (Add ENC1101L as a required corequisite.)

3 credits

Justification: AS part of the General Education improvement process, this lab was created to improve student writing skills. This lab will aid students toward success in ENC1101. ENC1101 and ENC1101L will be a linked for registration and withdrawal. Students may test out of the ENC1101L component through honors criteria (to be determined by advising). The English Cluster vote included the stipulation that students who stop attending ENC1101L will be awarded a FX (not WX) in order to avoid a student withdrawal from the co-req ENC 1101. (To exempt from this course requirement, students must meet one of the following test scores: SAT verbal score of 580 and math score of 1170, an ACT average score of 24 (English, Reading) or a PERT score of 113 for reading and PERT score of 123 for writing. If the student does not enroll in ENC1101 in the term of the exemption, the exemption will need to be reapplied.)

Discussion: This agenda item was tabled initially waiting for a representative from the English cluster to present the explanation of this curriculum action. It was noted when the action was addressed a phrase within the justification statement, the phrase "and math scores of 1170" was a typo and should not be included in the test score parameters for these English courses.

Bob Van Der Velde addressed this curriculum action for the English cluster at the end of the meeting indicating the need to address this action in time for spring term registration. He asked that the English cluster look the required scores for exemption be revised upon review by the English cluster, based upon actual experience with success in ENC1101 so that those students who do not need the extra lab will not be required to take it. E. Mueller agreed that the exemption score should be comparable to those accepted at four year institutions, which are lower. Ed also asked for clarification on the withdrawal statement "The English Cluster vote included the stipulation that students who stop attending ENC1101L will be awarded a FX (not WX) in order to avoid a student withdrawal from the co-req ENC 1101." The College cannot give a failing withdrawal grade to a student who drops the lab (as opposed to not attending without withdrawing) and currently the Panthernet system does not automatically drop the lecture course if a coreq is dropped, this would have to be a manual process.

Similar to the MAT1033L conversation, E. Mueller offered that transient students should be automatically exempt from this lab requirement. The addition of the lab is aimed at high school students who may not be college ready-transient students have more academic experience in writing. The exemption of this course for transient students would decrease the resulting process of notifying and evaluating all transient students as to their need to take this course, which in most cases would not be necessary. B. Van Der Velde indicate that the exemption could be automatic or at the request of the faculty.

MAT1033L Intermediate Algebra Lab (1 credit, 2 lab hours, AW grading scale, no prereq, coreq-MAT1033, no special fee) 1 credit

Revised Course Effective January 2014

MAT1033 Intermediate Algebra (Add MAT1033L as a required corequisite)

Justification: To increase the student success rate in MAT1033 Intermediate Algebra this co-requisite lab component was created.

Discussion: Garfield Basant represented the Math Cluster for this curriculum action. The MAT1033L was developed to assist student in being successful in MAT1033. The new course would be structure as a one lecture, one online lab hour course per week and attached to MAT1033 as a corequisite. E. Mueller questioned the exemption policy for this course. Currently all student who enroll in MAT1033 are required to take MAT1033L. Ed thinks that transient students should be automatically exempt from this lab requirement. The addition of the lab is aimed at high school students who may not

be college ready. Transient students have, in most cases, more academic experience in mathematics. The exemption of this course for transient students would decrease the resulting process of notifying and evaluating all transient students as to their need to take this course; which in most cases would not be necessary. B. Van Der Velde indicate that the exemption could be automatic or at the request of the faculty.

Reactivated Course

Effective January 2014

MVB2325 R Music-Applied-Private Instruction Tuba Sect S (Reinstate Five Year Rule inactive course as listed-2 credits, 2 lab hours, updated description, prerequisite MVB1315 R (two semesters) with a grade of B or higher; corequisites MUS0010L and MUN1120 R, AW grading system, \$100 Special fees, repeatable 6 times)

2 credits

Justification: Applied music lessons are individual instruction; a class may consist of one student. These classes are separated by instrument and level (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior). A student must take the correct class for his/her instrument and level. Due to the fluctuating population of music students, there are not students for all instruments every semester. In addition, not all students progress to the sophomore level for various reasons. This is why this particular course became inactive. The Music department currently have a tuba student who is preparing to transfer to a university to complete his music degree. He is currently taking his third semester of MVB 1315 R (freshman level) and needs to move forward into the sophomore level course for next semester.

Discussion: Allen Webber explained the process that the Music Department must go through periodically to reactivate practical music courses. Since the state assigns individual numbers to each instrument course, and the Five Year Rule requires infrequently used instrument courses to be inactivate if no enrollment is evident for five years, it is necessary to bring courses through curriculum for reactivation periodically when a student needs the next level of training in an instrument prior to transferring to the junior level. This is the case for this action for a current tuba student. E. Mueller asked why an exception to the Five Year Rule policy could not be made for Music courses since it is apparent that this is a repetitive action for the department and Curriculum Committee and does not really affect anything else. The committee was in general agreement with this idea.

4. Strategies (See revote comments and action starting on Page 10 concerning this curriculum action.)

Revised Course Effective January 2014

SLS1501 Strategies for College Success (Change title to Introduction to the College Experience, revise course description, revise course learning outcomes.)

3 credits

Justification: This course revision is part of the College's response to SB 1720. This course will now be a required course for all first time in college students. SLS 1501 will be a requirement for all First Time in College students who are degree seeking, not certificate seeking and all transfer students who have 14 credits or less. This required course does not apply to students seeking credit certificates (CCC), advanced technical diplomas or PSAV certificates. This will allow for a more consistent student experience across the different campuses and sections of the course.

Discussion: Manuel Larenas explained that this course's title, description and learning outcomes have been changed to make the course experience more cohesive across the College. The intent is to assist students in their experience with the

college environment but also to give them an opportunity to explore career options, develop an educational plan and strengthen academic skills.

There was some discussion about how this additional course fits into existing programs and it was clarified that this was a college admission requirement and does not apply to the program degree total. E. Mueller indicated that SLS 1501 is considered institutional credit for financial aid purposes. Plus PSAV students, considered first-time degree seeking student when they cross over to the AS degree, would take this course when they start their AS program.

B. Van Der Velde inquired as to why College Credit Certificates (CCCs) were excluded from the SLS1501 requirement, and suggested that the same logic would apply to Associate in Science programs. Bob suggested that while the SLS course is very worthwhile, A.S. degree programs have only a limited number of credit hours, some with no electives, so the addition of this requirement would lengthen the time to degree. S.B. 1720's legislative intent was to reduce the time needed for a degree, and even if the SLS requirement was not considered "excess hours" it would be an additional course required as "institutional credit", thereby lengthening the time to degree. Bob mentioned that A.S. program accrediting bodies may find the additional course requirement inconsistent with the stated number of hours to complete the degree. Manual pointed out that many incoming students select the A.S. degree but really do not know what they plan to do. The revised SLS 1501 would assist them in this determination.

ENCO017 College Reading and Writing (4 institutional credits, 4 lecture hours, Prerequisite: Non-Exempt students will need to provide CPT score of 0-82 (SS/RC) or PERT score of REA 50-105 and/or

ENG 50-102 Corequisite: SLS1501, AN grading system, \$25 special fee)

Justification: Per Florida Senate Bill SB1720 - Palm Beach State College has restructured developmental education course offerings per this bill's requirements effective October 31, 2013 for enrollment starting January 2014:

The bill restructures remedial college preparatory instruction as developmental education and requires Florida College System institutions to provide developmental education that is more tailored to the specific communication and computation skills a student needs to develop to be successful in performing college-level work. The bill does not repeal non-credit courses but requires colleges to offer developmental education options a student may pursue while also enrolled in college-credit courses. Students whose test scores indicate the need for developmental education must be advised of options and may enroll in the developmental education options of their choice.

4 credits

The bill specifies that two groups of students must not be required to take the common placement test or to enroll in developmental education:

- Students who entered 9th grade in a Florida public school in 2003-2004 or thereafter and who earned a standard Florida high school diploma; or
- Students who are serving as active duty members of the United States Armed Services.

Students who are not required to be tested or to enroll in developmental education may request assessment and may enroll in developmental education if they wish.

Discussion: Elizabeth Wilber and Carleton Chernekoff explained that this new developmental reading and writing course was created in response to SB 1720 which mandated that the existing developmental reading and writing courses be reconfigured into one accelerated course. There was a question about the need for the lab fee for this course and the response was that this mirrored what existed for the current developmental courses and covers the cost of the supplies required for the new course.

Justification: Course Revisions Due to the Florida Senate Bill 1720 the existing prerequisites of prep English courses are no longer allowed for these courses. AS Elective Changes When a student enters this program with an existing degree, the choices of electives are sometimes satisfied with general education courses from that degree. The student needs to take flight electives and be able to use their FA benefits but the fact that the electives are satisfied by other general education courses precludes them from doing so. Therefore, following courses need to be removed from the electives: ECO2013 Principles of Macroeconomics, ECO2023 Principles of Microeconomics, MAN2021 Principles of Management, and POS1001 Introduction to Political Science. If the student plans to transfer this degree to a bachelor's degree rather than choosing to immediately pursue a flight career, the Department Chair will evaluate this on a case by case basis.

Discussion: Judy Maxwell explained the two reasons for the curriculum actions presented: 1.) Due to the changes in the requirements of placement testing through SB1720, it will be difficult to enforce the prep requirements for ASC1101, ASC1210, ASC1640, ASC2550 and ATT1100. After talking to faculty in the math cluster and advising professionals, it was determined that the former prerequisites will be met by the order in which students take the required General Education courses in math and English within the program and the current prereqs will be dropped. 2.) In order to

strengthen students flight skills, the program agreed to remove the non-flight courses from the elective credits so that students' selection of electives would be flight related only. Judy indicated that one item that was overlooked was the needed electives for students transferring to specific programs out of the AS degree. In these cases, students need to complete specific non-flight elective courses and to this end she asked to add the statement "or any AA or AS course approved by the department chair." E. Mueller agreed to this but indicated that Judy would need to provide a list of acceptable courses for degree audit.

writing. If the student does not enroll in ENC1101 in the term of the exemption, the exemption will need to be reapplied.)

This will allow for a more consistent student experience across the different campuses and sections of the course.

The reason for revoting on these agenda items is because the motions from the original meeting included items that are not in the purview of the Curriculum Committee. They are either a faculty decision, re: grade, or Administrative decisions re: college policies and procedures. The Administration determines the college policy on student exemptions from a course, test scores needed for testing out of a course and if students can test out of a course, and what degree (AA, AS, AAS) students will be required to take a course.

For ENC1101L: 1) the FX grade is a faculty decision on how to assign a grade and what that grade will be, and 2) transient students are not exempt from the lab.

For MAT1033L: 1) transient students are not exempt from the lab, and 2) If a student believes they should be in a higher math course, they can take the placement test to determine placement.

For SLS1501: 1) ALL AS and AA students as well as Transient students will be required to take this course as an Admissions requirement, 2) As an Admissions requirement, it does not add credits to the existing program credits, and 3) Since the majority of AS students already take Strategies it should not be an issue for program accrediting agencies.

Colleagues,

The curriculum committee is, essentially, an advisory body. I believe we owe the College our best advice, which of course may not always be welcomed or followed.

I vote Yes as to the MAT1033L proposal, as transient students may exempt themselves by taking the appropriate placement test.

As to the ENC1101L proposal, I continue to believe that the exemption standards which were brought to the curriculum committee as part of the presented proposal should be carefully reviewed by the English faculty, informed by data about student success, so although I am generally supportive of adding this course, I must vote No on the ENC1011L proposal as presented.

As to the SLS1501 proposal as presented, I believe that this is inconsistent with the legislative intent behind SB1720. Whether the additional three credit hours are considered "admission requirements", "excess hours", or simply extra hours, it would nevertheless extend the time to degree/completion for AS and CCC students (though most if

not all AA students would be able to take the course as part of the legislatively mandated 60 hours for that degree). I have seen no data (either by individual program or for all AS/CCC programs) that show a majority of students already take the SLS class, and I believe that accrediting bodies will consider this "admission requirement" to be inconsistent with our representations as to how many credit hours are necessary to earn an AS degree or College Credit Certificate. Having served as a member of the board of one of these bodies, I believe this will be a significant issue for at least some of our AS programs. I must therefore vote No as to the SLS1501 proposal as presented.

As a lawyer, I am quite used to having objections overruled, but nevertheless they should be made for the record.

ENC1101L is a critical piece in helping our students improve their writing skills. We know that we will see the most underprepared group of new students in ENC 1101 in more than two decades. We also know that our bachelor degree faculty have reported how many of our students struggle with writing assignments.

As far as SLS, we know that the majority of AS students were already were taking this course as most started in prep. IRE has the data to back that up. This same argument could have been made for prep courses in AS programs. What we are missing is the great benefit that SLS provides to students to help them in all degree programs. This is a crucial piece of our FYE program to keep students enrolled.

These are challenging times with changes that will bring unknown consequences for many underprepared students. Doing nothing with a wait and see attitude will cause more students to fail.
