Additional Program Changes: ACG 2022 will be added as a lower division selection to T702, T702A, T703A, T801, T801A, T803, and T803A to allow for the addition of this course as a prerequisite for FIN 3400, which is required in all of these programs.

#### Justification:

**GEB 3453 Development**: Managers nowadays are confronted with increasingly complex environments and face challenges trying to balance economic, legal and ethical responsibilities vis-a-vis the stakeholder groups with which they interact. This course investigates the spectrum of business ethics and social responsibility issues that managers face in today's organization.

FIN 3400 Revision: The BAS cluster analyzed learning outcome assessment data for 2 cycles (2009-2010 & 2011-2012) and determined that our FIN3400 students, on average, were missing the performance targets established with the Office of Institutional Research and Effectiveness (IRE). An initial study revealed that at least 8 other State of Florida institutions require an accounting pre-requisite for their FIN3400 course. Based on input from students, BAS instructors, and PBSC Business Administration Accounting professors, the BAS Faculty moved (4-1) to implement Financial Accounting (ACG2022) as a pre-requisite for the course FIN3400.

**The Bachelor Program Faculty Cluster** recognized the following additional curriculum actions necessary to improve student success in the BAS in Supervision and Management:

- Revise BUL 3130, FIN 3400, GEB 3213, MAN 3025 and MAN 3240 to have no upper level prerequisites other than admission into the BAS program as necessary (they will retain their lower level prerequisites.)
- FIN3400 & GEB3213 will become "hard" prerequisites for all other courses in the BAS Supervision and Management program except MAN3240, MAN3025 and BUL3130.
- For fulltime status, students may select any four of the five courses listed above for the first term. Students are required to complete FIN3400 and GEB3213 prior to taking <u>any BAS</u> courses beyond MAN3240, MAN3025, and BUL3130.
- The above changes apply to T701, T701A, T702, T702A, T703 and T703A degree courses
- Additional program changes will occur for T701 and T701A

  - o Changing MAN4162 to become an elective
  - o Changing GEB4891 to become a required concentration area course

<u>Justification:</u> **GRA 1190C, GRA 2191C**-Most of Palm Beach State Graphic Design students transfer to Florida Atlantic University and FAU have changed their program requirements for these students. The Palm Beach State Graphic Design program faculty are making these course revisions to reflect the changes made at FAU and better serve the students in a world where software and technology are constantly changing and evolving.

**GRA 2121C, GRA 2122C**- QuarkXPress is no longer the industry standard software. By changing the course title the Graphic Design faculty hope to avoid being tied to out-of-date software and descriptions of what students achieve in the course.

**Multimedia Arts CCC**- Enrollment has dropped critically low in the multimedia certificate program (CCC 6022). The web design certificate (CCC 6023) and the AS degree are still doing well and are not being altered at this time. In an effort to save the Multimedia Arts CCC program the Graphic Design faculty cluster would like to infuse two new required courses for the Multimedia Arts Certificate. The Multimedia Arts CCC minor revisions are:

- Substitute GRA 2136 Multimedia Video Editing with GRA 2144 Graphic Web Design.
- Substitute GRA 1190C Graphic Design 1 for PGY 1401 Intro to Photography

These two minor substitutions would provide students in the Multimedia Arts CCC a greater opportunity to develop a richer print and web based graphic design portfolio that is needed in this ever changing job market. Please note the courses being substituted would still be available as electives and still offered as requirements in the Web Design Certificate and AS degree.
