This would allow students who passed one portion but failed the other to register for the failed portion again without being required to take the portion they passed again. **Justification:** The School District of Palm Beach County requires CTE (Career and Technical Education) instructors/teachers to take four Education courses in order to obtain a Career and Technical Education District Professional Certification. In past partnership meetings between the School District and the College, the need for a CTE district certification program has been discussed. Many of the CTE teachers were referred to take courses at private universities to satisfy these course requirements because Palm Beach State only offered two of the four courses required. The remaining two courses have since been developed to satisfy all 4 course requirements. The Education Cluster propose to offer the School District approved four courses as an advanced technical certificate (ATC) which will meet the district career and technical education certification requirements at an affordable rate. By adding this new ATC, we also strengthen the partnership with the School District. Currently CTE teachers are taking three of the four courses as non-degree seeking students. By adding this ATC, Palm Beach State can also capture FTE and ultimately program completers taking these courses for certification purposes. This program is proposed as a controlled access program. Students will need to be accepted to the program in order to enroll in EPI0001 and EPI0002. Program code and access discussed with the College Registrar.

**Discussion:** Susy Martinez-White explained that this new program addresses a need in the School District to provide certification training for Career and Technical professional in the District. Though it is a state certification, the state puts the responsibility of the training on the District to provide. Prior to the development of the final course Curriculum Construction, students were gathering a course at various public and private post-secondary schools in the County. This program will gather all the required courses in one location and provide the training at an affordable cost to CTE professionals. B. Van Der Velde mentioned that this configuration of courses would be a good foundation for adjunct faculty at the College and recommended to Susy that possibly an abbreviated version of the program be offered for faculty.

**Justification: LE Basic Training and Correctional Crossover to LE PSAV Certificates:** The FDLE Professionalism Division is responsible for the design, implementation, maintenance, evaluation, and revision of job-related curricula for the commission-approved basic recruit, advanced, specialized, and specialized instructor training programs for law enforcement, correctional, and correctional probation officers. The changes above are mandated by FDLE effective August 2014.

**Correctional Probation Crossover PSAV Deletion:** Three program specific courses were inactivated in 20123 per the Five Year Rule. Since the rest of the course were being revised to fit other CJ programs and there has been no enrollment in this program since May 2012, it was decided that the program was no longer needed and should be inactivated.

**Discussion:** K. Gamble shared that these actions were mandated by Florida Department of Law Enforcement and will be in effect as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014. Palm Beach State College is required to offer the updated curriculum for the academies and special training and so this was presented to curriculum to be effective fall term 20151. In addition, while reviewing the proposed changes, it was determined that the Corrections Probation Officer Crossover program had not had enrollment since 2010 and three courses had been designated 5 Year Rule courses in 2012, so the cluster decided to clean-up their offerings and remove that program from the College listing. E. Mueller asked if the program planned to offer the new versions of the programs soon after July and Kathy indicated that the next offering of the revised programs would be later in the Fall term.
