ITEM 2. Creation of New Certificates for Motion Picture Curriculum drawing from courses in the Motion Picture Production Track.

Discussion:

Certificates focusing on Cinematography and Directing/Producing. These certificates will serve as increased entry points for students with varied professional goals beyond our current post-production certificate for this track. Each certificate will draw from courses already in the track with the addition of a new course (Managing Post-Production for *Directors, Producers & Cinematographers*) for the Cinematography and the Directing/Producing certificate that will also be an additional elective for the A.S. track in

Motion Picture Production.

Discussion:	FIL2480C - Directing for Film will have its pre-requisites removed to align it with other entry level courses in the Motion Picture Production curriculum. DIG2300C and DIG2370C will have the pre-req of FIL2044 removed since it is not also included/required by the Digital Animation certificate. DIG2430C will have its co-req of FIL2100 removed since it is not also included/required by the Digital Animation certificate.
