

Nathan Selikoff's solo exhibit “Process & Influence” opens at Palm Beach State College Feb. 16

(Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. – Jan. 27, 2010) The Art Gallery at Eissey Campus at Palm Beach State College presents “Process & Influence,” the first solo exhibition by Orlando artist Nathan Selikoff from Feb. 16 through March 25. The opening reception will be Wednesday, Feb. 16 from 5 - 8 p.m. The reception and exhibit are free and open to the public.

Using the computer as his primary artistic tool and pulling from such diverse areas as chaos and population simulation, Selikoff mixes mathematics and the traditional elements of design to create experimental cutting edge art. “Process & Influence” will showcase artifacts from each step of his creative process, from ideas to experiments, tools, images, animations, and artwork across a variety of media.

Selikoff studied fine art and computer science at the University of Central Florida. He has exhibited in galleries and venues throughout the United States and around the world. In 2008 he participated in a three-week residency at the Atlantic Center for the Arts in New Smyrna Beach, studying under master artist John F. Simon, Jr.

On Wednesday, April 6, Selikoff will give two visiting artist lectures titled, “The Confluence of Chaos and Computation in Generative Visual Art.” He will speak about the recent history of computers, mathematics and generative visual art, and its influence on his work, describing the inspiration for the pieces and answering questions about the art. The first lecture takes place in Room NS 129 in the Natural Science building on the Lake Worth campus, 4200 Congress Ave. The second lecture begins at 6 p.m. in Room SC127 in the Bioscience Technology Complex on the Palm Beach Gardens campus. The lectures are free and open to the public.
