Palm Beach State College to celebrate opening of new amphitheater on Palm Beach Gardens campus

What: Palm Beach State College is celebrating the opening of its new amphitheater on the Palm Beach Gardens campus. It is the College's first outdoor amphitheater. Located in the center of the campus with 1,205-square-feet of covered space, the amphitheater is part of the \$339,102 second phase of a major campus green improvement project. The first phase, which included construction of the Myrna Rubenstein Pavilion, was completed in 2008. It also includes a pond, eco-friendly landscape and a grassy sitting area. The facility will have shows open to the public.

When: Tuesday, April 12 from noon to 4 p.m. with entertainment and fun. The amphitheater ribbon cutting with College and local leaders will be held at 3:30 p.m.
