The Gallery at Eissey Campus to exhibit
"Celebration of Diversity-Women Artists"

(Dec. 17, 2007 – Palm Beach Gardens) The four women artists featured in the "Celebration of Diversity" exhibition differ in their backgrounds and the various media they use, but all convey messages about the emotional and spiritual lives of women. Their techniques include collage, assemblage, fabric, three-dimensional paintings and porcelain clay. The "Celebration of Diversity—Women Artists" exhibition at Palm Beach Community College in Palm Beach Gardens opens January 8 and ends February 22. The artists' reception is January 8 from 5 to 8 p.m.

Artist Tonya Clay expresses the emotional impact of social issues in her three-dimensional paintings. Dorotha Grace Lemeh explores her African-American heritage and women's body images in her collage and assemblage art, creating work she hopes will promote reflection. Georgeta Fondos wrinkles, bends, crumples, sands, burns and rips acrylic paint, fabric and objects to create images from the conscious and subconscious minds with themes of conversation, coexistence and contradiction. Gerbi Tsesarska creates porcelain clay pots with three levels of meaning, inspired by the interaction between nature and the creative human spirit.

The Gallery at Eissey Campus is open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Tuesday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. The gallery is in the BB Building at Palm Beach Community College in Palm Beach Gardens, 3160 PGA Blvd. The gallery's number is 561-207-5015.
