PBCC Palm Beach Gardens campus gallery presents “And four decades later...” art and photography exhibition

(Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. – Oct. 12, 2009) Palm Beach Community College’s The Gallery at Eissey Campus in Palm Beach Gardens presents the exhibition “And four decades later...” from Oct. 20 through Nov. 25.

“And four decades later...” takes a look back at 1969 and then jumps to the present, featuring the work of artists Wayne and Sherry Stephens as they celebrate four decades of art-making and marriage. A sampling of their early work facilitates that trip back in time, and current photographs by Sherry and paintings by Wayne bring the show up to date.



Sherry Stephens’ photographic compositions have resulted from the marriage of digital and traditional photography. She shoots with both a film camera and digitally and sometimes composites photographic images with direct scans of natural materials. Wayne Stephens’ artworks are unplanned, impulsive, and spontaneous, evolving from a heightened awareness of color, light, subtle textures, and lines.

The Stephens met while making art at Ohio State University in the 1960s and currently teach fine arts at Palm Beach Community College.

Opening reception is Tuesday, Oct. 20 from 5 to 8 p.m. The gallery is located in the arts and humanities building, room 113. Gallery hours are Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Tuesday 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.; Friday 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. For more information call (561) 207-5015
