### **"A Report Card on Obama" will be held March 22 at Palm Beach State College**

(Lake Worth, Fla. - March 18, 2010) Two local politicians and a congressional candidate will serve on a panel at Palm Beach State College March 22 to discuss President Barack Obama's performance since taking office last year.
