



Palm Beach State College issues nationwide call for entries in second Photography/Digital Imagery Competition

(Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. – March 30, 2010) The Art Gallery at Eissey Campus at Palm Beach State College has issued a nationwide call for entries in its second juried Photography/Digital Imagery Competition.

The competition is open to all artists 18 years of age who are legal United States residents. The theme of the show is open interpretation represented by traditional and digital photography, as well as digitally-created images. Awards are \$1,000 for first place; \$500 for second place, and \$250 for third place.

Artists must submit their work on a CD as a high-resolution, jpeg file. Image size should be approximately 1200 x1880 pixels (4 x 6 inches at 300 ppi). A non-refundable entry fee of \$10 per image is to be included with the application. The deadline for entries is May 1. Accepted applicants will be notified via e-mail by July 30, and accepted works are to arrive at the gallery from Sept. 6 – 17.

The opening reception and winner notification is from 5 to 8 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 19 at the gallery, and the exhibition will run through Nov. 24. Proceeds from the show will fund fine art scholarships at the College.

The judge for the competition will be artist and photographer Anna Tomczak. Tomczak's large-format dye transfer photographs have been widely exhibited across the country and are in museum, university, private and corporate collections.
