



Green Expo at Palm Beach State May 4

Radio show host Missy Strauss among workshop presenters at free community event

(Lake Worth, Fla. – April 12, 2013) Palm Beach State College will hold its fifth annual Green Expo May 4, giving individuals and families an opportunity to learn about resources and get tips on how to become more eco-friendly.

The Saturday event, hosted by Palm Beach State's [Center for Green Construction and Energy](#), will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Education and Training Center on the Lake Worth campus on the southeast corner of Lake Worth Road and Congress Avenue. It is free and open to the public.

Attendees can learn how to reduce environmental impact, increase their awareness of greenhouse emissions and climate change and learn how to contribute to a healthy planet. Government agencies, nonprofit groups, businesses and other exhibitors will be on hand to display environmentally friendly products as well as provide information on many "green" resources. Free sustainability and green living workshops also will be held throughout the day.

Among the presenters are: **Missy Strauss**, co-founder of "Our Greener World," a one-hour radio program about healthy living, president of TangibleGreen and an adjunct faculty member at Palm Beach State, who will discuss "greenwashing." **Eugene Fagan**, a Florida Registered Architect and a Palm Beach State adjunct professor of REVIT (building design software), will discuss the benefits of using REVIT for sustainable construction. There also will be information about [green trades](#), programs and offerings at PBSC.
