### Justification:

MAC 1147 is a combination Precalculus and Trigonometry- courses which are currently offered at Palm Beach State College. This course is being offered at schools across the state, including FAU and Broward College, so the course number and objectives are already in place. Our current courses are being filled to the maximum and a need has been identified to offer this combination course. Students will be able to take MAC 1147 in lieu of MAC 1140 and MAC 1114 to satisfy prerequisites for MAC 2311. This course will be particularly attractive to the engineering student and the student over the traditional age that is serious and conscientious, wanting to move on to the Calculus series in a timely fashion. It will provide an alternative, allowing the student to complete MAC 1140 and MAC 1114 as prerequisites to MAC 2311 in one term, rather than two.

**Discussion:** Professor Barbara Sharp outlined the reasons for developing this combined course, which is primarily aimed at engineering students who want to progress through Precalculus and Trigonometry at an a more accelerated pace than taking both courses separately. Entrance into the course will be limited to those who obtained a "B" or better in the prerequisites course MAC 1105.

### Justification:

These program courses are currently being offered as a CCE course, but should be included in a PSAV program.

The reasons for moving these courses to a PSAV program are:

- Curriculum provides a coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare students for this career. There are attendance requirements, assignments, case studies, and final exam.
- The PSAV curriculum is approved by the Florida DOE and Florida Department of Financial Services for students
  wanting to get their Accredited Claims Adjuster license and their Registered Customer Service Representative
  license.
- The program is a planned sequence of instruction, each consisting of one Occupational Completion Point.
- This would put all of the pre-licensing courses together and would be consistent in college application and pricing structures.

**Discussion:** Program manager, Gwen Nicholson outlined the reasons for creating these two new PSAV programs. The courses were offered through CCE but students were confused as to whether these courses would prepare them for applying for certification. Since the state offers these PSAV curriculum frameworks, creating these programs would allow the program completion to be posted on the student transcript thus facilitating students application for certification. This curriculum action would, additionally, lead to an increase in Workforce Alliance students participating in the programs since these would now be a recognized programs at Palm Beach State College.

<u>Justification:</u> The program managers met and with the assistance of Ed Mueller, addressed how to fix the on-going registration and financial aid disconnects for students in these programs for over two years. Currently, students register for each course in sequence and upon successful completion can register for the next course. Two problems continuously occurred: 1) Course grades do not process in time to allow for registration, requiring continuous registration over-rides 2.) Financial aid software in Panthernet does not communicate with Panthernet registration software which negatively impacts/disconnects student's financial aid.

### The solution:

- +In order to work within the parameters of the Panthernet software all course pre-requisites and co-requisites must Be removed so that students can register for a block of courses on the program wheel at one time.
- +All the programs above are Limited Access/Controlled Access which means that a program designator is assigned to each course in the program and each course is completed in sequence.
- +Upon acceptance to the program the same special designator is assigned to the student which provides for seamless registration coupled with no negative impact to the student's financial aid.
- +The pre/co requisites had been added to all courses in order to limit non-declared program majors from registering in program classes prior to the Limited/Controlled Access designation of the programs. The Limited/Controlled Access designation solved that issue; therefore, there is no need to keep the pre-co requisites to all courses.
- +Students in the program must take the courses in sequence and progress is monitored by the program and course faculty.
- +Removing the pre and co requisites has no impact on the course content, outline, objectives or outcomes.

### Justification for early effective date

Please note that the programs are requesting that the removal of the pre and co-requisites to all courses take effective immediately in order to assure seamless registration and financial aid qualification for students as soon as possible. Removal of the pre and co-requisites does not impact any course content/outcomes or program outcomes.

**Discussion:** Rose Anne Roche was spokesperson for the three programs affected by these course changes (Medical Assisting, Practical Nursing and Surgical Technology). All these programs are now limited access programs and both the courses and the students are given exclusive designators to allow limited enrollment in these courses. Since these courses are always taken sequentially, the need for attaching pre and corequisites to these courses no longer exists. This will also eliminate the problems with registration and financial aid that had occurred with a series of courses taken in the same term. T. Fairbanks asked 1.) if this was basically a registration correction and not an

academic revision to the programs and 2.) whether the sequence of courses and their prerequisite knowledge was listed somewhere so that students know that the courses are sequential in nature. Rose Anne confirmed that this is not an academic revision to the program but primarily a registration correction. She indicated that since students must be accepted into the programs to take these courses, they establish a cohort which progresses through the programs together and there is an understanding of the sequential nature of the competencies taught. The sequence of courses is listed both in the catalog, on the Area of Study web pages for the programs and the program managers closely advise their students through these programs so there is no opportunity to take the courses out of sequence.

- Requesting the grading system for the Patient Care Assistant Program courses HCP0120 Nursing Assistant, HCP0300 Home Health Aide, and HCP0620 Patient Care Assistant be changed from S/U to A/N system
- The first course in the program, HSC0003 Health Care Concepts is already graded A/N
- Second course, HSC0003L LAB IS 12 HOURS, strictly lab with no exams and graded S/U
- The other courses above have several exams in each one and instructors already average out the exams since students must achieve a "75" average in order to pass the didactic portion of the course.
- It has been a constant source of disappointment for many students that they will only receive a grade of satisfactory, when their test average may be 90 or above.

**Discussion:** Rose Anne Roche explained that the grading system changes for these HCP courses was a move to provide students who might transfer onto another program or who are being hired by an agency an opportunity to better reflect the student's success in mastering the theoretical competencies within the courses. HSC 0003, which is shared by other Health PSAV programs is already graded AN and HCP 0003L will retain the SU grading System since it is a skills course. Most PSAV programs are moving to the AN grading system as an incentive for students to succeed in the courses they complete versus just reflecting satisfactory completion. B. Herrington asked what the cut off score was for an "A-C" grade for these courses. An "A" is 93% or above, a "B" 87-92% and a "C" is 75-86%.
