I. Approval of October 28, 2010 Minutes and November 5-12, 2010 Electronic Vote

Discussion: T. Fairbanks asked for clarification of the science course offerings listed as part of the General Education requirements and the Lower Division Common Prerequisites Courses for the BSN approved by the November 5-12, 2010 email vote. There was confusion about how the credits were presented and some discussion concerning this issue. The end result of the discussion was that the science course and labs have to be taken as part of the RN program and the two different listings within the program course list reflect how the credits count in the overall 121 credits of the BSN.

Both T. Fairbanks and B. Russell expressed concern that this program development was approved via email vote versus an in person meeting of the committee. K. Gamble explained that the program listing and preliminary course descriptions was submitted to the Curriculum Committee as an email vote in order to verify faculty development of the initial program list in order to submit the BSN to SACS for approval to continue the development of the program. Once approved to continue development and faculty are hired for this program, the program list and the related developed courses will return to the Curriculum committee for closer review and approval. At that time the committee will review the course development and any subsequent changes to the program list at one of its regularly scheduled meetings.

BCN 2941 Building Construction Experience (Change credits from 3 to 4, pre requisites remain the same)

<u>Justification</u>-This course revision was overlooked in the April 22, 2010 curriculum agenda, though it was listed in the program correctly. This is a Prior Learning Experience course and students need to provide documentation of 4 years of bona fide experience toward journeyman level tradesmanship to earn the program credit.

Discussion: Roland Holt reviewed the program changes that were done during the April 2010 Curriculum Committee to revises the Industrial Operations Management AAS to an AS, revise the two existing credit certification related to that degree and create the new Sustainable Construction Technology AS. When developing the SCT AS the department ended up with

3

63 credits, when 64 credits were required to adhere to the Building Construction Technology curriculum frameworks the program is being based on. Since BCN 2941 Building Construction Experience required 4 years of journey man experience to qualify for the credit, the department decided to change the course credit from 3 to 4 credits. This was listed on the program course list submitted in April but the paperwork for the course revision was not submitted. This curriculum action is to correct this oversight.

Justification: This action is being requested so that there is a smoother transition between the College Credit Certificate and the Degree. Currently SBM2000, Small Business Management is required in the certificate, but not the degree. The Business Cluster and the BPC feel there will be more completers if the certificate and degree requirements are more closely aligned. In addition, the prefix ACO will be removed from the elective choices since there are no longer any ACO credit courses offered at Palm Beach State College.

Discussion: Peggy Adams-King told the committee that the changes to the Business Administration AAS were to bring the program more in line with the required courses for the related credit certificate. She indicated that the cluster found that there were few completers of the credit certificate because SBM 200 Small Business Management is a required coursed for the credit certificate and only an elective for the AAS. It is hoped that this change will increase completers of the credit certificate. The second change to the BAM AAS was a housekeeping action since Palm Beach State no longer offers any ACO prefix courses.
