# Current Computer Programming (2126), Internet Services Technology (2122), Networking Administrator (2123)

All proposed new courses will be added to the Business/Computer Elective selections for each of these programs (listed in program as prefix selection as opposed to individual courses.)

Justification: COP2657: A recent search of cross-platform mobile application development jobs on various hiring websites turned up over 100 jobs in Florida alone. This confirms the industry demand for individuals with cross-platform mobile application development knowledge. This course is included in the Mobile Application Development CCC. COP2665: Industry demand for individuals with knowledge of iOS development remains high. A recent online search for jobs revealed thousands of jobs noting iOS knowledge in Florida. This course is part of the Mobile Application Development CCC. CTS 2933: This special topic course in computer science and information technology introduces students with the latest and emerging topics in the field. The idea stems from the discussion of Tech talk 2014 (e.g., Data Analytic) and not only provides students with the state-of-the-art topics in the field but allows the college and faculties to gauge interests in the emerging technologies for curriculum revisions as well as new curriculum development. This course will be developed from term to term and assigned a unique course number with each offering. CGS1513 and CGS1543: Changes made to the prerequisites to allow Health Science students to complete their classes for their programs in a timely manner. COP2700: Course title changed to reflect course content. Pre-requisites changed to allow Health Science students to complete their classes for their programs in a timely manner. COP2800 and COP2805: The learning outcome modifications and additions address updating the courses per the latest Java industry standards. The pre-requisite change puts the Java classes in line with the pre-requisites required for the other programming language courses, COP2822 and COP2840: These revisions bring the course descriptions and learning outcomes up to date. Cisco CCNA Security and Network Security CCCs: This CCC development for Palm Beach State College as part of Round 3 of the Department of Labor Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training Grant Program (TAACCCT). Specifications of the grant require that the two certificates be in place by January 2015 (20152). The certificates addresses a huge need and opportunity to train people in the area of preventing and defending cybersecurity attacks. There is a lack of stackable education and training in this area. These CCCs along with current AS and BAS degree in networking and information management will provide the needed credentials. These certificates are an expansion of the current CCC in Cisco CCNA.
