Revised Course **Effective January 2013**  
FFP 1822 Emergency Management Systems, Principles and Practice (Change title to “Introduction to Emergency Management and Homeland Security”) 3

**Justification:** This course title change will better fit the course learning outcomes and the industry standards and terminology within Transportation Security Administration training programs. Since the course would be offered Spring term, it was recommended that it be sent to the VPAA for emergency approval so that the course can be loaded correctly for Spring Term. Dr. Sass approved the action November 13, 2012.

**Action and Justification:** This is the basic level, single semester course for Emergency Medical Services that feeds the Paramedic program and the Firefighter Program. This is a limited access enrollment process that currently is requiring the TABE test upon entrance. The TABE test is not a requirement for credit programs, only PSAV and it is incorrectly posted on the application. Florida statute does not require testing for this training program. This housekeeping action was discussed by Dr. Sass and Deans’ Council and approved in October 2012.

**Justification-** The items (and rationale) are as follows:

- MVB 2322R Music-Applied-Private Instruction French Horn S – Reactivate- This is a sophomore level applied music course. Palm Beach State College has not had a sophomore level French horn student for several years, therefore it has become inactive. There is currently a French Horn student in her third semester of the freshman level course and should be advanced to the sophomore level course for next semester. This action was approved in Cluster Minutes 10/12/12 and new learning outcomes approved in email vote (11/6/12)
- MUN 1440R Percussion Ensemble – Reactivate- Palm Beach State College offers small ensemble classes to give students more advanced skill training but working in an ensemble with only one player per part and no conductor. For example, currently MUN 1430R Brass Ensemble is offered. There are a number of percussion students at this time, and the Music Department would like to offer the same experience to percussion students as we currently offer to some other areas (Brass, Guitar, etc.) This action was approved (and new learning outcomes approved) in email cluster vote (11/6/12)
- MUT 1241L Ear Training and Sight-singing 1 – Revision- Change Co-requisites from “MUT1111 or equivalent and MVK1111 A or equivalent” to “MUT1111 or equivalent and MVK1111 A, MVK 1314R, or equivalent” (added text highlighted). Music students whose principal instrument is piano do not take MVK 1111A (a beginning level group class). Instead, they take MVK 1314R, a more advanced level applied music course. Adding this course to the co-requisites (either MVK 1111A or MVK 1314R) will eliminate the need for overrides for these students and make the process more efficient.
