Justification: Web Development CCC: The state recently revised the curriculum framework for this certificate to be 35 or 36 credits. Because of this the cluster decided to change this CCC to an even number of credits, 36, rather than 35. This allows the removal of the two one credit classes (CGS1561 Inside the PC and OST1831 Microsoft Windows) which were not particularly relevant to the program, but were just added to make the previously required 35 credits. The replacement of these two one credit classes, with a single three credit class, C Programming, will help the students be better prepared to take COP 2840 Server-Side Programming. COP 1220 Introduction to C Programming is required for the Internet Services Technology AS degree. Internet Services Technology AS: With the credit change of the CCC and the removal of two required courses that are no longer applicable to the degree, the cluster took the opportunity to streamline the electives for this AS program to 6 credits rather than four. The removal of these two one credit classes, which were not particularly relevant to the program will be replaced with Business/Computer elective credits.
