<u>Justification</u>: According to Florida Office of Articulation, college credit certificates must articulate into an AS degree and the courses contained therein must be a part of that AS degree program. OST 2335 to GEB 2214- This revision is necessary since for both the Accounting Technology CCC and AS degree. In OST 2335, the emphasis is on business communications as they apply to the administrative assistant. In GEB 2214, the emphasis will be on business communications as they apply to the business manager. Developing excellent communication skills is important to career success. Employers indicate that communication skills are critical to effective job placement, career advancement, and organizational success. This change is also required since OST 2335 was converted to GEB 2214 and will no longer be offered at Palm Beach State College. In addition to this program change, a recommendation has been added to the CCC for the order that students should take the typing courses which will also change the course sequence for the certificate.

Discussion: Robin D'Agati outlined the changes that were being done to the credit Accounting Technology CCC and AS as explained in the justification. She indicated that the note added to the program list about OST 1141L being taken

before OST 1108 was to ensure that students had the proper typing technique before increasing their typing speed. OST 1108 was not made a prereq of OST 1141L so that student who could prove proper typing training would not need permission to take OST 1141L. E. Mueller asked if the OST courses were being taught by Masters level faculty. P. Adams-King indicated that not all of them were and therefore they could not be added to the BAS lower level course list for articulation.

<u>Justification:</u> The Department of Children and Families, as well as, the Department of Education required that afterschool practitioners complete the state-mandated 40-hour certification training as a pre-requisite to the School Age Professional Certificate (SAPC). The SAPC program is 120 clock hours; Part 1-40 hour certification training which can be fulfilled by either the 40-Hr Birth-5 Years Old certification or 40-Hr School Age certification; and 80-Hour School Age Professional Certificate modules.

The Childcare Department determined that all of the graduates for the SAPC (5373) program are not being captured accurately. When their transcript were checked was discovered that the SAPC was not annotated that the students graduated from the program. It was was discovered that the students did not complete the program according to the degree audit which lists the following courses for the program: HEV0803, HEV0804, HEV0194 & HEV0195. However, both DCF and FLDOE allow for the student to fulfill the 40-hour certification training prerequisite for this program either by completing HEV804 & HEV805 or HEV0114, HEV0115 & HEV0198, therefore, the program listing needed to be revise in the catalog and degree audit for this program accordingly. By revising the program to allow both 40-Hour certification training options the college would more accurately report the number of graduates from this program and student's transcript would be annotated that he/she successfully completed the program.

Discussion: Sheila Scott-Lubin explained that students actually had an alternative option to complete the Group A 40 contact hours for this PSAV certificate but that this was not included in the curriculum action I 2009 and was only discovered when students completed the program requirements but were not awarded the certificate as expected. E. Mueller asked if the listing in the agenda would be reflected in the catalog this way. G. Spain indicated that this configuration is how the program would be listed in the catalog and the Area of Study page.

Justification: The Florida Department of Education frameworks for the Health Information Management A.S. program have been revised to change the title of the program to Health Information Technology. This change will align the program name with the certification, Registered Health Information Technician, for which the students prepare to sit once completing the program. Additionally, the program is increasing statewide from 67 credits to 70 credits, which is due to increased competencies in the industry. This will also allow the addition of new program, Health Informatics Specialist College Credit Certificate. Course name changes and updates to prerequisites will better represent course content and ensure that the additional credits added will not extend the full-time program length.

Discussion: Julia Steff explained that the changes to the Health Information Management AS were reflective of changes at the state level: this program would now be called Health Information technology and the total credits increase for 67 to 70. Since a new course needed to be added to meet the new credit limit, it was n opportunity to offer a new credit certification Health Informatics Specialist for 18 credits. All courses included in the certificate articulate to the AS degree. The rest of the course changes were to facilitate the 70 credits in the AS and align the course titles with the updated curriculum frameworks.

<u>Justification</u>: This is a certificate program that has been running well for several years. The purpose of the proposed change is to make the 6219 CCC available on-line in addition to retaining the conventional classroom approach (or allowing a mix). The change makes CCC6219 available on-line as well as in the classroom, or as a mix. There is no change to any courses or to the broader certificate requirements. It is merely a minor tweak in course selection completely within the existing framework. In the existing requirements a student may replace BOT2000 (which is offered frequently on-line and in the classroom) with an approved elective. In the proposed new requirements the ability to use an approved elective to replace a course is switched to replacing "GCO2230 or SWS1102," neither of which are offered on-line.

Discussion: T. Fairbanks represented George Rogers of the Horticulture program and indicated that the change to this certificate was to make BOT 2000 a required course rather than a selection of a group of courses. K. Gamble further added that this was also to allow students to take the certificate totally online. E. Muller pointed out that there was some redundancy in the certificate listing since a specific GCO course (GCO 2230) was already indicated in the alternative "Any course with the prefix ...GCO". This will lead to confusion for the student. The committee recommended the changes to this certificate be approved with the additional removal of the GCO 2230 listing as a specific selection option leaving the "SWS 1102 or Any course with the prefix..." in place. This would be sufficient for a student to make a usable selection. K. Gamble will confirm that this change to the program listing does not cause any unforeseen problems for Dr. Rogers. Confirmation with Dr. Rogers indicated that he agreed with the revision recommended by the committee.
