The addition of Motion Picture Production 3 as a new capstone course to provide reinforcement and advancement opportunities for students to participate in more production projects. With only two current Production courses running in Fall and Spring, Summer semester students did not have the same opportunities for their technical courses to tie into production projects. The third class will also allow us to restructure the goals of the existing two courses to provide further advancement in the complexity of projects and the student assigned tasks. A modified Suggested Course Sequence was also presented to accommodate changes.

Justification: Both the Health Science Faculty Cluster and the Program Advisory Board approve replacing the CHM 1032 required natural science with any transferable chemistry course and the removal of the five year rule on natural science courses for the Dental Hygiene program. The removal of the selection of the specific course CHM1032 Principles of Chemistry was considered because students do not need a specific level of chemistry to pass national boards and this change would allow students to use courses already taken to qualify them for admission to the program. In addition, removing this specific course listing will eliminate the need to process course substitutions so that a student can complete the program. For the removal of 5 year natural science rule for Dental Hygiene selection it was determined that the currency of 5 year natural science rule did not improve overall student success and did not enhance program outcomes (National Dental Hygiene Board Exam, Florida Clinical Licensure) or positively or negatively impacted program outcomes. In addition, Financial Aid will not pay for repeat of courses already completed successfully. Program data indicated that a time limit of either 5 or 10 years for any of these natural sciences prevented students applying to programs who may be better candidates. Students take these courses one at a time prior to acceptance into a Limited Access program. Students are not applying the knowledge at that time. Regardless of any time limit, application of natural sciences specifically to a discipline is reviewed and applied to outcomes of program core classes.
