Justification: IND1234C-By making IND1401C a prerequisite of IND1234C and co-requisite of IND2424C, students will have the technical foundation required to continue building and developing presentation and construction drawings. These drawings are part of the design process and students who do not pass IND1401C will lack the skills necessary to produce and perform well in both IND2424C and IND1234C. IND2460C-After various semesters of content development and assessments (exercises, projects, etc.), faculty have concluded that IND2424C is not needed as a prerequisite for students to succeed in IND2460C. They do need a foundation on 2D graphic communication which they acquire in IND1401C. Thus, changing the prerequisite to IND1401C will continue to provide with the knowledge necessary to effectively learn 2D computer drafting. IND2608C- After various semesters of content development and assessments (activities, assignments, etc.), faculty have concluded that IND2424C nor IND1234C are not needed as prerequisites for students to succeed in IND2608C. They do need a foundation in interior design and graphic communication which they acquire in IND1233C and IND1401C respectively. Thus, changing the prerequisites will continue to provide with the knowledge necessary to effectively learn about sustainability and its role in the design process.

Added entrance requirement: Students who have successfully completed FFP0010 Firefighter 1 or obtained the Firefighter 1 certification from the Florida Bureau of Fire Science which is older than six months will have to take a challenge exam for these competencies and pass it with a 70% score to be placed in FFP0020 Firefighter 2 to complete this program.

Justification: The new edition of Essentials of Firefighting and Fire Department Operations (6th Ed) that is used for the Firefighter course adopted January 2014 separates the Firefighter course into two parts in line with the Department of Education. In the past it was difficult to separate the drill stations and lectures to offer the program as two separate models. Firefighter 1 will allow a student to take a state test and receive certification as a Firefighter 1 with the Bureau of Fire Services. PBSC will be able to accept students that have completed a Firefighter 1 program elsewhere and become eligible for a career job in the fire service with the completion of a Firefighter 2 program. If the program is split PBSC has the opportunity to have a full class of completers. Currently, if a student drops the Firefighter program a replacement student cannot be added to the class because of the structure. With this program revision, students can be added to maintain a class size of 24 students. This will help the department meet the projected demand to offer this course independently for students who have completed the Firefighter 1.
