The BAS faculty requests the separation of the capstone courses by discipline-one for Database Administration students and one for Security and Network Assurance (IT Forensics) students.

**Justification:** The current Microbiology courses at PBSC, MCB2010/L do not adequately prepare students going onto four years schools in majors of biology, biotechnology, microbiology, pre-health (medical, dental and veterinary) and some health related majors such as medical laboratory science. The new courses, MCB2XXX and MCB2XXXL are designed to be cover general biology in more detail and with greater rigor. They require BSC1010/L and CHM1046/L as prerequisites and CHM2210/L as corequisites.

Developmental education courses are to be accelerated, compressed and/or modularized. MAT0022 is the first of these courses to be developed effective January 2014. For this course nonexempt students will need to take the PERT Placement and the PERT math diagnostic test.
