

CLUSTER MEETING MINUTES

ENGLISH Oct. 23, 2010 1:30- 3:00 BA 204

ITEM 1. ENC 1101/ENC 1102 and adjunct supplemental reader text

Discussion: Associate Dean Diane Bifano announced to the cluster that there would be a limit of two

supplementary readers that adjuncts may choose from for 1101 and 1102. These will be in addition to the already approved Bedford Handbook. This effort is being made in order to create consistency. Department chairs will recommend titles for the spring cluster

meeting. The cluster will then vote to approve the supplementary text.

Action: Associate Dean Diane Bifano will spearhead the discussion with Department Chairs before

the spring vote. Cluster will vote on Department Chair recommendations in the spring.

ITEM 2. ENC 1101/1102 Content Issues

Discussion: Nick LaRocca presented the cluster with a recap of the minutes from the 1101/1102

subcommittee meeting. There was general discussion about the issues with writing labs and if students are prepared to advance from prep to ENC 1101. It was suggested that there be a forum for prep faculty, lab tutors and faculty to discuss strengths and weaknesses and have an open dialogue about the issues. Also discussed was the content of 1101 classes. The question was raised as to whether documentation / research should be taught as part of

1101. Course Core outlines were distributed and discussed.

ITEM 3: 2010 Florida Congressional Update

Discussion: John Ribar gave a general update concerning the continuing issues with the online classes.

He said there had been a meeting with Dr. Gallon to discuss the concerns. Dr. Gallon is

interested in the teacher's predicament with online teaching issues.

Item 8: Writing Sample for placement in writing courses

Discussion: Steve Brahlek discussed the need for a writing sample for placement in ENC 1101. The

multiple choice test given does not reflect preparedness for ENC 1101. Steve Brahlek is developing a grading rubric for the placement test. Once the test is created students will be

needed to pilot the placement test.

Action: Test is being developed and will need to be piloted

Item 9: Diagnostic Essay for ENC 1101

Discussion: Steve Brahlek led the discussion concerning the need for a diagnostic essay for ENC 1101.

The diagnostic test essay would provide an objective evaluation of student writing The test would need to be given early in the semester (probably the 3rd week of class). The essay would be graded holistically and the instructors could provide feedback to students. The students would be provided with a sheet that designated areas which need improvement. There is a need for funding for grading of the test as well as 2 Chair Persons. A rubric

needs to be developed as well as setting the writing anchor.

The item was voted on and passed unanimously.

Action: The proposal will be presented to the Assessment Committee.
