ITEM 1. APPOINTMENT OF NEW MTIS CLUSTER CHAIR

Discussion: Due to the retirement of previous MTIS chair, group unanimously voted for Willie Ford to serve

as the new committee chair for the 2013/2014 year. Chris Cobb agreed to serve for the 2014/2015

year and Ricardo will serve 2015/2016.

ITEM 2. BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)

Discussion: Willie reported to the group that a committee is being formed to consider options and

implementation of faculty bringing their own devices – laptops, iPads, etc. - into college

classrooms/offices. Topics that are being addressed include: network ramifications and antivirus

protection and possible stipends for faculty compensation.

Action: Willie will be representing MTIS departments college-wide. MTIS managers will meet to discuss

the impact the faculty devices could have on department operations.

ITEM 3. MONDOPAD

Discussion: Chris updated the group on current status of his campus' Mondopad usage. PBG and BG are the

only campuses that currently own an Infocus Mondopad. The 55" and 70" built-in PC and interactive whiteboards provide document annotation and videoconferencing capabilities for

conference rooms.

Action: MTIS Managers for BR and LW will consider requesting Mondopads in their 2014/2015 capital

budgets.

ITEM 4. DIGITAL SIGNAGE

Discussion: Group discussed the current signage systems being used and how information is provided

throughout each campus.

ITEM 5. CABLE TV AROUND CAMPUS

Discussion: Discussed various aspects of cable TV on each campus. BR campus considering upgrading their

current headend equipment. Mediaedge equipment, capabilities, and issues were also discussed. PBG has notified their campus that they will be eliminating its VHS media collection. All agreed that it is not cost effective to continue purchasing and supporting DVD/VCR combos in the

classrooms.

ITEM 6. CCUMC ROUNDUP – MAIN TOPICS/ISSUES

Discussion: Ricardo attended the CCUMC conference in October and recapped the topics discussed at the

event. He reported that nationwide media centers are working to provide new collaboration and learning places where students can meet together to work on group/individual projects. Integration of media technology into these learning centers is essential. HDMI connectivity was also a hot topic. When discussing budgets, Ricardo learned that most other colleges are not getting the

budget they need to retro-fit outdated media equipment.
