ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

FOR A.S. DEGREE GRADUATES IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION BETWEEN FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY AND PALM BEACH COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Purpose:

The intention of this agreement is to formally establish an articulation mechanism for graduates of the A.S Degree in Early Childhood Education at Palm Beach Community College to transfer into the Bachelor in Early Care and Education degree in Florida Atlantic University's College of Education. The agreement provides an opportunity for students who enroll in the A.S. degree in Early Childhood Education at PBCC to complete a Bachelor in Early Care and Education degree at FAU. This agreement, dated July 21, 2008, will last for a maximum of five years after which both institutions will undertake renegotiation of the agreement.

For Palm Beach Community College A.S. in Early Childhood Education degree graduates, Florida Atlantic University will:

- 1. Accept 60 credits of Palm Beach Community College A.S. Early Childhood Education undergraduate courses successfully completed with a minimum grade point average of 2.5, into the Bachelor in Early Care and Education degree. These courses are listed in Exhibit A.
- 2. Provide transcript review and advisement for each student as part of FAU's College of Education processes.
- 3. Periodically review and evaluate the performance of PBCC graduates who transfer into FAU by assessing students' academic preparation and their success at FAU. This data will serve as a criterion for renegotiation of this agreement at the end of the aforementioned five-year period.

As part of this agreement, PBCC and FAU will:

- 1. Publicize this agreement among students and faculty.
- 2. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement.
- 3. Identify problems and work together cooperatively to adjust details of course sequences and content so that students can transfer without academic disruptions.
- 4. Notify each other regarding any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement.
- 5. Agree to the cancellations of this agreement with 30 days prior notice from Florida Atlantic University or Palm Beach Community College.
