Articulation Agreement Between Palm Beach Community College and Palmer College of Chiropractic

The purpose of this agreement is to enhance the transition of Associate degree graduates from Palm Beach Community College into baccalaureate degree programs at Palmer College of Chiropractic Davenport Campus. The following agreement shall establish the conditions under which students from Palm Beach Community College shall progress to senior or upper division status. This agreement is without a specified termination date; however, either party may terminate the agreement at any time provided students then currently enrolled shall be allowed to complete their course of studies pursuant to the terms of the agreement in effect at the time of termination.

NOTE: Students wishing to participate under the terms and conditions of this agreement must complete an Associate degree program at Palm Beach Community College.

I. Articulation conditions for all Palm Beach Community College Associate Degree Graduates admitted to Palmer College of Chiropractic:

- A. Palmer College of Chiropractic shall accept the required general education credits earned at Palm Beach Community College, applying them toward the equivalent lower division, general education requirements at Palmer College of Chiropractic.
- B. Acceptance to Palmer College of Chiropractic will be contingent upon meeting all Palmer College of Chiropractic admissions requirements.
- C. Palm Beach Community College courses not applied to Palmer College of Chiropractic general distribution, major or specialization will be accepted and applied as general elective credits.
- D. Admissions, financial aid, advisement, and registration services will be provided by Palmer College of Chiropractic to those students who express an interest.

II. Palm Beach Community College will provide the following:

- A. Recruitment Table: Space on campus for promotion of Palmer College of Chiropractic.
- B. Visit Awareness Marketing: Palm Beach Community College will actively promote baccalaureate degree-granting institution campus visits [i.e., posters, brochures].

Candidates are selected based on several factors (which may include GPA) total number of credits completed, prerequisite GPA, and the personal profile/essays. Personal interviews may be conducted. We request that you apply one year in advance. Applications received later than 60 days prior to enrollment may not be considered.

The Palmer College of Chiropractic prerequisites for admission to the Doctor of Chiropractic degree program are in compliance with the standards, rules and guidelines of the Council on Chiropractic Education (CCE).

The intensive Palmer curriculum demands a thorough undergraduate preparation. In the admissions procedure, each candidate is evaluated on academic performance, science courses performance and the total number of hours of college credit completed. All applicants must furnish proof of having acquired a minimum of 90 semester hours or equivalent of college credit leading toward a baccalaureate degree at an institution or institutions accredited at the college level by an accrediting body that has been listed as nationally recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education.

All entering students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on a 4.00 scale for:

- the required prerequisite courses
- the required 90 semester hours

If your GPA falls below the present CCE minimum, feel free to contact the Admissions Department. We may be able to help you meet the matriculation requirements. Call us if you have any questions

For most students it will be necessary to complete 8-10 hours in each of the sciences to fulfill the minimum academic year requirement. The applicant should have completed courses in the sciences selected from the pre-chiropractic or pre-medical curricula recommended by your undergraduate institution(s).

The required credits must be earned with a grade of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale or better. Undergraduate credit earned at a nationally accredited college or university must be applicable toward a baccalaureate degree. Inquiries regarding the acceptability of specific prerequisite courses satisfying Palmer requirements are welcome. Please include a photocopy of your college's course offerings and course descriptions with your questions. This will enable us to assist you in selecting the proper courses.

Please note: Individual state licensing boards may require additional education prior to entering a chiropractic college. Alabama, Florida, Kansas, Maryland, Montana, North Carolina, Rhode Island, Tennessee, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and the United States Virgin Islands require a backelor's degree in order to gain state licensure. Although it is not a prerequisite for admission, Palmer College of Chiropractic recommends students complete a bachelor's degree prior to entering the Doctor of Chiropractic program. Applicants who have carned a bachelor's degree prior to being accepted into Palmer's Florida Campus program will be awarded priority seating. A bachelor's degree is required in order to graduate from the Doctor of Chiropractic program at our Florida Campus. It is imperative that you confirm all information with the licensing board of the state, province or country in which you desire to be licensed.
