Curricular Articulation Agreement between Lynn University and Palm Beach Community College (PBCC) The Donald and Helen Ross College of Education.

This Articulation Agreement grants students who have completed the Associate in Science degree in Early Childhood Education with a Preschool Education emphasis at Palm Beach Community College with a 2.55 or better GPA and completion of the Florida Teacher Certification Exam (FTCE)-General Knowledge tests, acceptance into the Ross College of Education Bachelors of Science in Elementary Education Grades K-6 Plus Pre-K/Primary (Age 3- Grade 3).

The Associate in Science degree in the area of study in Early Childhood Education with a Preschool Education emphasis from PBCC will be accepted in full, with the 63 credit hours of the program applied toward Lynn University's undergraduate core curriculum and the listed Education courses within the major articulated. (*See the list of articulated courses included with this form.*)

This agreement is renewable in two (2) years or sooner if a change of curriculum occurs at either institution.
