Justification: Due to the impact of COVID, it was necessary to make changes in the sequence of dental hygiene clinic and didactic courses. The Dental Hygiene program was one of the initial programs to Return to Campus, by extending DH clinics into the Summer B session, to enable student to graduate and complete courses that were interrupted by COVID. Three foundations courses, Periodontology, Pathology and Compromised Patients were also moved to the Summer C session. These changes were made in the anticipation that clinics were going to have to be run simultaneously, in order to make up lost clinic time due to COVID-19, and enable the students to get back to their DH curriculum schedule to complete the DH program.

Since the curriculum change turned out to be a positive action, the DH faculty would like to make the revisions on- going in the DH program.

Starting Summer2021: DEH 2801L Dental Hygiene Clinic II will be changed permanently to a full Summer C course. The extra credit needed to make this happen will be taken from Compromised Patient (which will be discontinued as a course) The subject material in Compromised Patient is currently being taught several DH courses.
