Description of Funds:

The recipient will receive a one-time \$1,000 scholarship to be applied to qualified expenses, including graduate and undergraduate tuition, fees, books, and on-campus room and board for the 2012-2013 academic year. Funds are provided by USDish.com. Payments are issued by USDish.com, made payable to the student's approved college or university and mailed after January 25, 2013 directly to the accredited college or university last designated by the student.

Presidential Scholarship and Educational Initiative for Community College Students
Inspired by a series of conversations with Chancellor Cheryl Hyman (IIT, CS 1996) of the City Colleges of Chicago and the presidents of the City Colleges of Chicago, in 2010 Illinois Institute of Technology announced a major new scholarship and educational outreach initiative — the Presidential Scholarship. Through this initiative, IIT is determined to substantially redefine the pipeline initiatives within the fields of science and psychology, technology, engineering, and mathematics, as well as business and architecture — hereafter referred to as STEM+ fields — and to significantly engage students at every level throughout the educational community from K-12 through the community colleges to four-year institutions. Collaborating institutions and organizations are committed to serve as a catalyst to support students toward their goals to conduct undergraduate research and earn advanced professional and academic degrees in STEM+ fields.

In Fall 2010, IIT welcomed the first cohort of Presidential Scholars from the City Colleges of Chicago. Recognized by their sending communities as accomplished students with outstanding promise for future academic work at the undergraduate level and for the pursuit of advanced and professional degrees, and leadership within their community, 26 students from the City Colleges of Chicago — as well as 28 students from Sir Arthur Lewis Community College in St. Lucia — entered IIT as undergraduates supported by the Presidential Scholarship.

Students who are granted an official nomination by their institution's President and admitted to IIT are considered by IIT's scholarship committee for the Presidential Scholarship. Recipients of the Presidential Scholarship receive:

- \$23,500 annual tuition scholarship award, renewable for up to three years at IIT*
 - \$5,000 annual housing scholarship award to support on-campus residence at the university
 - Up to \$5,000 stipend for undergraduate research through IIT's Undergraduate Research Scholars Program
- *Renewal of the Presidential Scholarship is contingent upon completion of 100 hours of volunteer STEM+ community outreach per academic year that engage and bridge their home and sending communities with the communities at the university and in the IIT/Bronzeville neighborhood and the city of Chicago. Additionally, recipients of the Presidential Scholarship must maintain full-time enrollment and make satisfactory academic progress.

How to Apply:

In addition to meeting all stated deadlines and eligibility requirements (see below), students interested in applying for the Presidential Scholarship must:

- Complete an IIT application for admission
 - Download and complete the Presidential Scholarship Form
 - Submit the completed Presidential Scholarship Form (with the required essay and an unofficial transcript from your nominating institution) to your college's Dean of Instruction or other designated liaison (see list below) to request an official nomination from the President of your college
- PLEASE NOTE: Only Presidential Scholarship Forms that are signed by the President of their eligible institution and submitted to IIT will be considered for the Presidential Scholarship.

Scholarships for High School Seniors

Alvin J. Cox Memorial Scholarship (Open to All)

The Alvin J. Cox memorial fund was established in 2006 to provide financial assistance to those attending a college or university. Alvin Cox spent more than 40 years as a public school teacher and advisor to students going through the college admissions process. Mr. Cox dedicated a large portion of his career to finding financial assistance for those who were unable to afford college tuition (please follow this link for more information on Mr. Alvin Cox). After his passing in 2006 his family decided to continue on with Mr. Cox's mission through the creation of the Alvin J. Cox Memorial Scholarship. Since 2006 we've awarded 94 scholarship awards to students in seven countries.

Current Scholarship for 2010 we are offering 15 individual scholarships, each worth \$700 USD. Several smaller awards may also be issued. To be eligible for the scholarship you must either be enrolled, or have been accepted to enroll in college (minimum of 3 hours / one class) during the summer or fall semesters of 2010. High school students who will be enrolled in dual credit courses that require out of pocket expenses are also eligible to apply.

There are no special eligibility requirements for the scholarship. All students may apply regardless of their race, nationality or financial status. We ask that each student who wishes to apply write a brief essay. The essay should be in size 12 font, and no longer than two pages single-spaced (four pages double).

The essay must be based on the following topic:

Your reason for deciding to attend college - please discuss any factors that influenced your decision to pursue a college degree. You may discuss any people who affected your decision making process and explain how your decision may have been different without their influence.
