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## **Executive Summary**

### **Headcount**

Districtwide, total headcount for credit/prep and noncredit combined increased by 1.4% from Summer Term 2006 to Summer Term 2007. The increase was due to growing enrollment in credit/prep courses at Lake Worth, Palm Beach Gardens and Belle Glade (off campus). All campuses, except Belle Glade, experienced a drop in non-credit enrollment, which resulted in a decline of close to 2.0% for the district.

### **Demographics**

Between Summer Term 2006 and Summer Term 2007, the number of Hispanic students increased by 13.8% districtwide. The number of white, non-Hispanic students declined by close to 1.0% and was down by 16.6% from Summer Term 2004. The black student population remained fairly stable from 2006 to 2007, but was down by 9.0% from Summer Term 2004.

Overall, the proportion of males to females has remained stable from 2004 through 2007, with males accounting for approximately 43.0% of the entire student body and females making up around 56.0%. The male student body lost 12.9% of its members since 2004, while the female population decreased by 10.6%.

The student body continues to grow younger, with students under 25 years accounting for 56.3% of all students during Summer Term 2007, compared to 49.5% during Summer Term 2004. This trend was consistent across all campuses except Belle Glade Off-Campus, which has experienced a drop in dual-enrolled students under age 18.

### **FTE**

Total FTE increased by 2.0% during Summer Term 2007, due mainly to increases in credit, prep and PSAV hours. PSV FTE (A.S. and A.A.S) decreased by 13.4% between Summer Terms 2006 and 2007, and was down by 10.6% from 2004. This trend was consistent across all campuses.

### **Declared Program**

The number of students who claimed to be pursuing an AA degree rose 3.3% between 2006 and 2007 and by 8.1% from 2004. Those who are working toward certificates or special diplomas increased by 49.4%, due in part to the addition of the Educator Preparation Institute. All campuses experienced the upward trend in AA degree-seekers.

### **Credit/Prep FTE and the Number of Sections Offered**

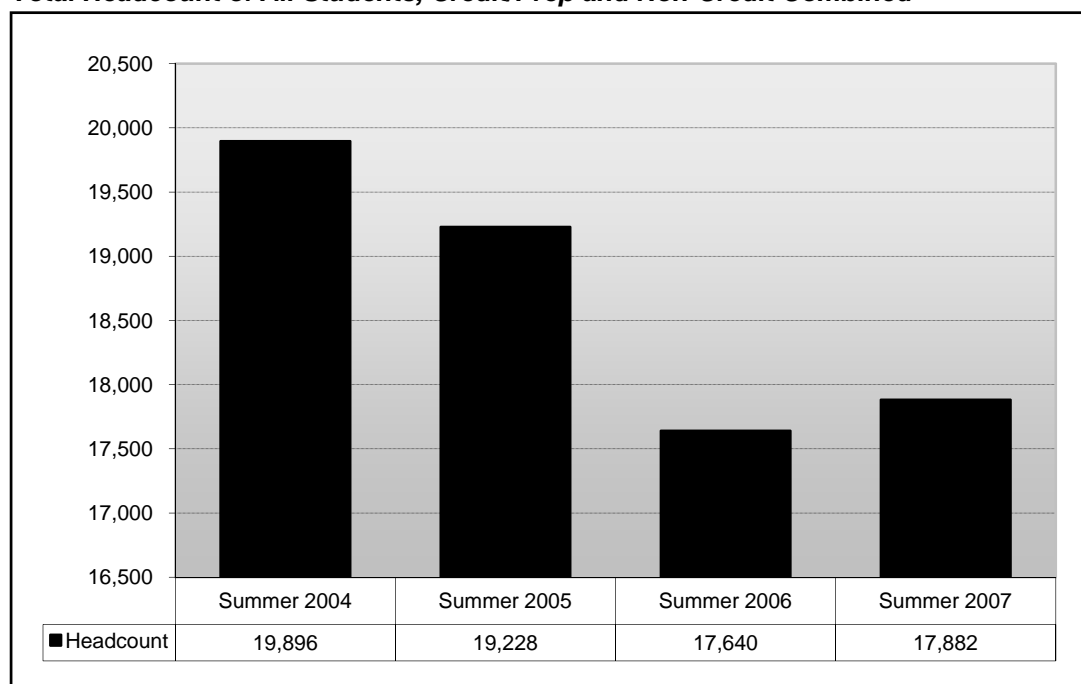
Cost efficiency depends, in part, on how closely the number of sections offered follows the rise and fall of FTE. Districtwide, the number of sections offered increased by 5.2% between Summer Terms 2004 and 2007, while FTE decreased by 2.6%. As a result, seat occupancy dropped from 77.8% in 2004 to 73.5% in 2007.

## District

### Headcount

Total headcount during summer terms at PBCC had been decreasing since 2004. Headcount dropped by 3.4% from summer 2004 to summer 2005 and 8.3% from Summer 2005 to Summer 2006. The trend reversed during Summer Term 2007 when total headcount increased by 1.4%.

#### Total Headcount of All Students, Credit/Prep and Non-Credit Combined<sup>1</sup>

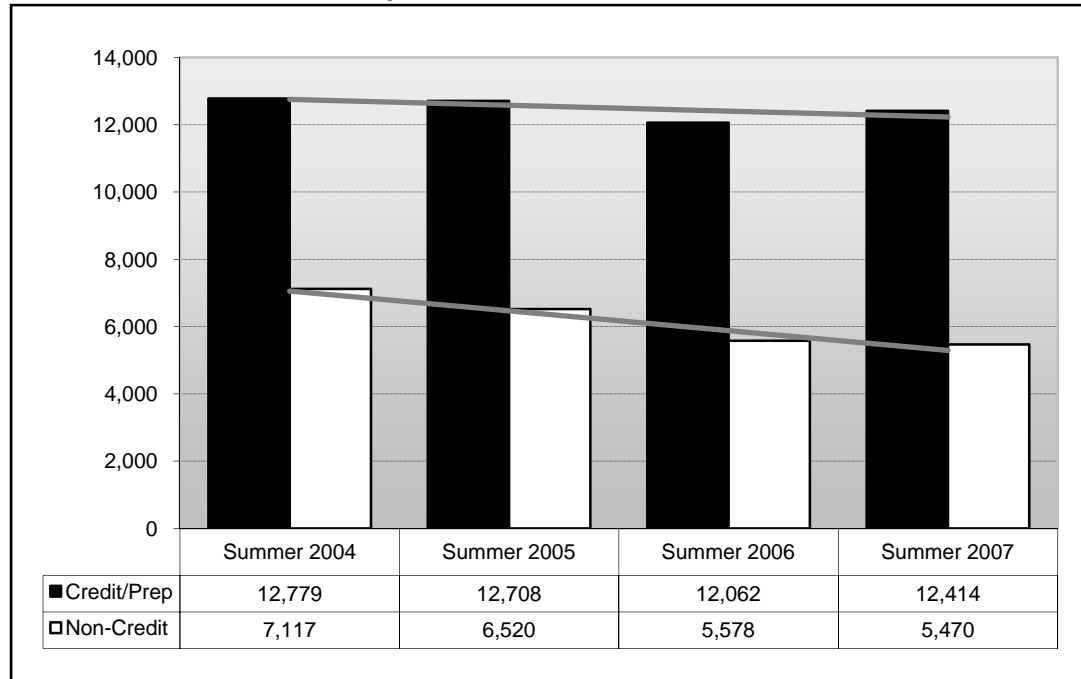
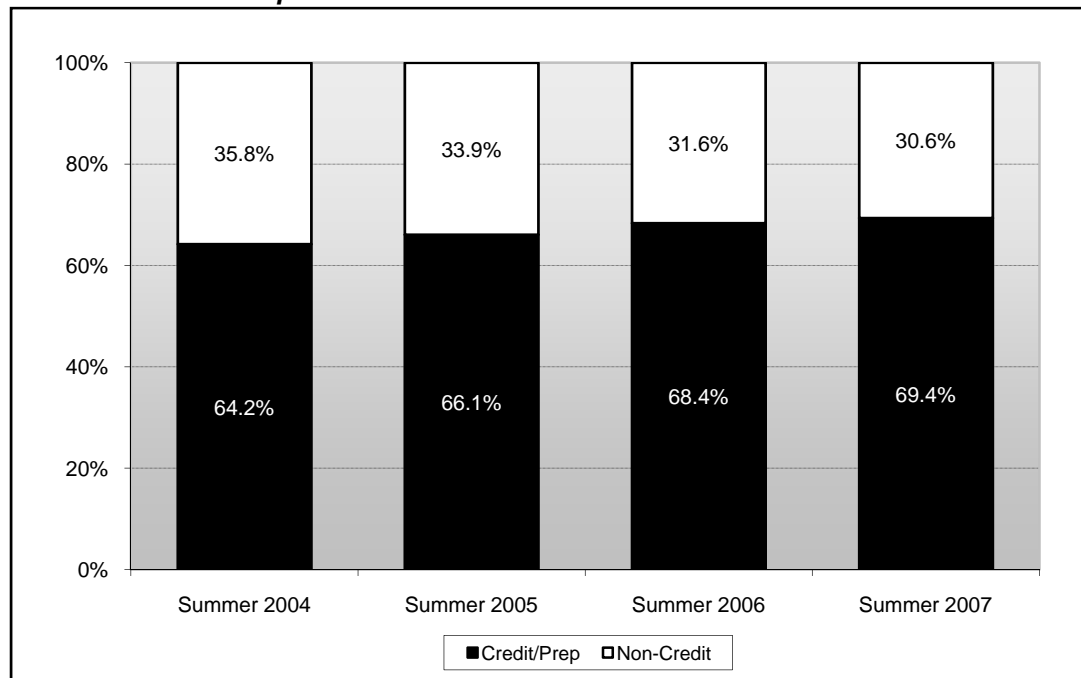


Headcount from students enrolled in credit/prep classes dropped by 5.1% from Summer Term 2005 to Summer Term 2006 and then grew by 2.9% during Summer Term 2007. Headcount from students enrolled in non-credit only classes had been steadily decreasing, but slowed during Summer Term 2007, down by only 1.9%. As a result, the percentage of students classified as credit/prep increased from 64.2% to the current level of 69.4%. The proportion of non-credit students decreased from 35.8% to 30.6% during the same period.

## Demographics

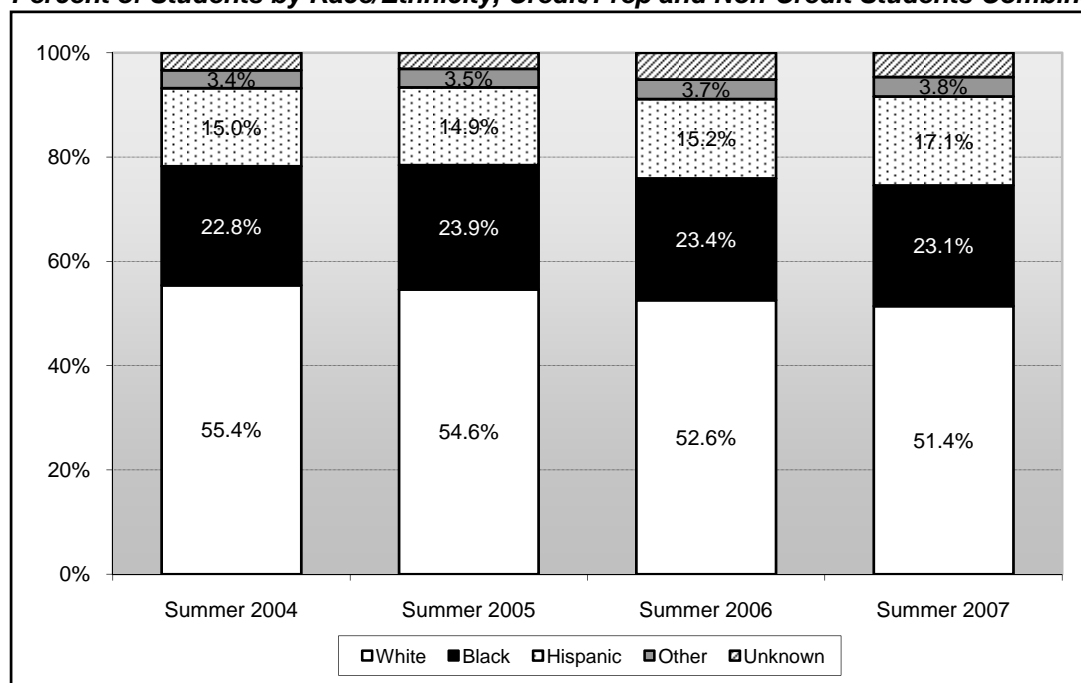
### Race/Ethnicity

The student body has become more diverse since Summer Term 2004. The Hispanic student population increased the most, growing by 2.4% from Summer 2004 to Summer 2007. Overall, the minority portion of students grew from 41.2% in 2004 to 44.0% in 2007. The white, non-Hispanic segment decreased by 16.6% and accounted for 51.4% of the student body during Term Summer 2007, down from 55.4% during Summer Term 2004. The black student population decreased by 9.0% since Summer Term 2004.

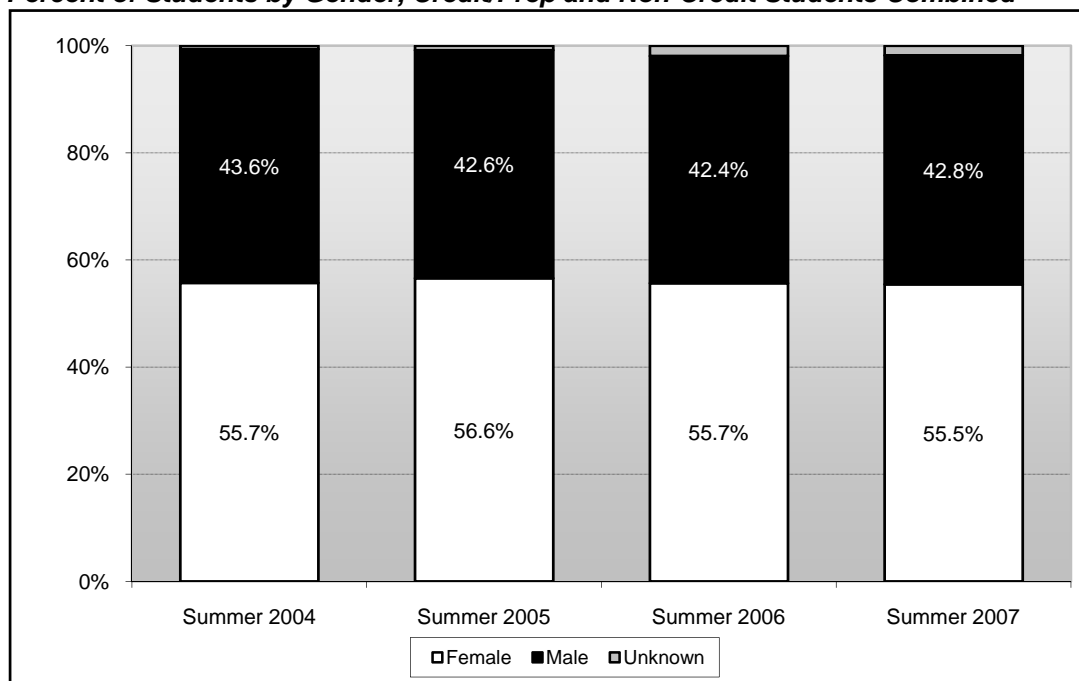
## Gender

Student gender has remained constant at approximately 55.0% female and 43.0% male. The percent changes between 2004 and 2007 are similar for males (-10.6%) and females (-12.0%).

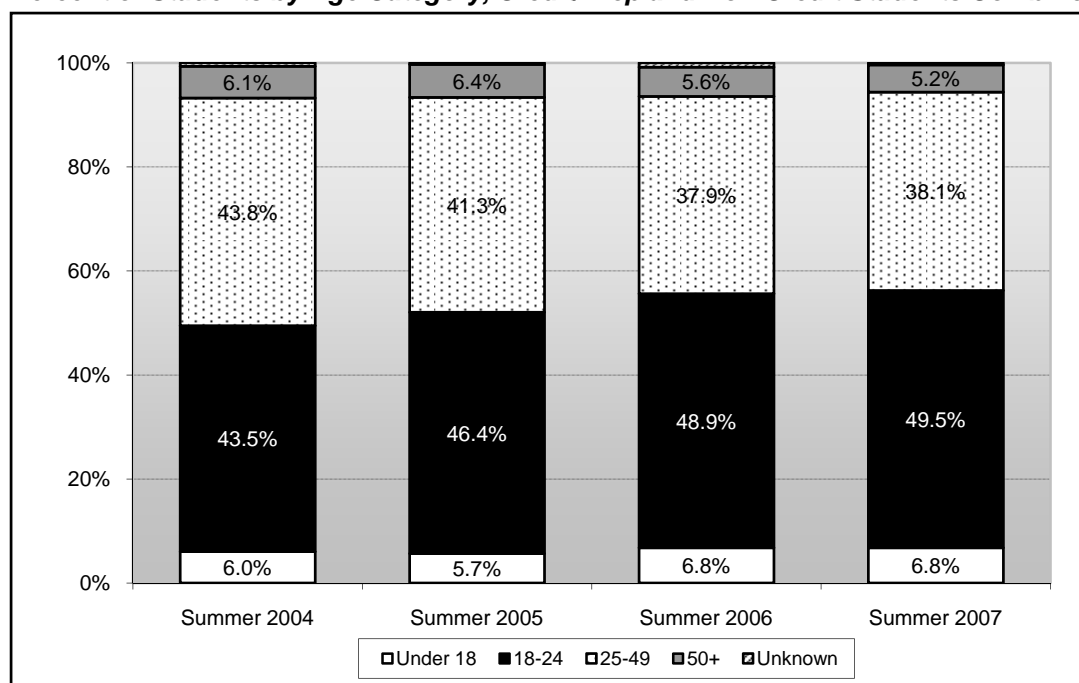
## Age

The student body has grown younger, with 56.3% of all students under age 25 during Summer Term 2007, compared with 49.5% under age 25 during Summer Term 2004. The number of students between ages 25 and 49 fell by 21.7% from 2004 to 2007, and the number of students over age 50 dropped by 22.5% during that same time frame.

**FTE**

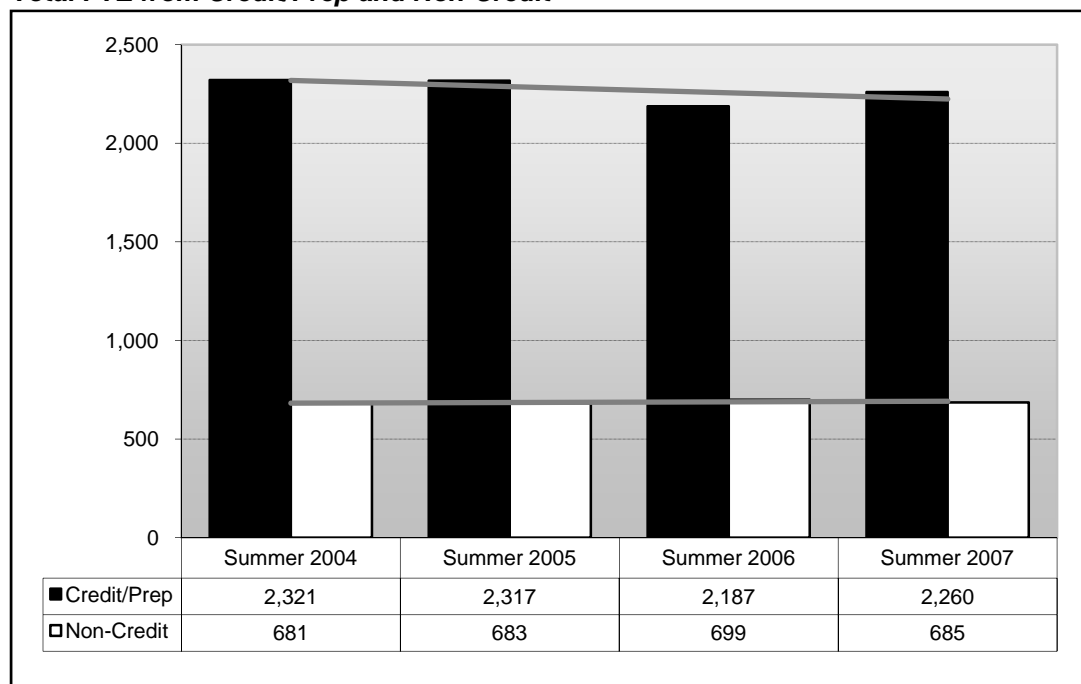
FTE from credit/prep rebounded by 3.3% during Summer 2007 after dropping by 5.6% between Summer Term 2005 and Summer Term 2006. Overall, FTE from credit/prep is down by 2.6% from Summer Term 2004. PSV FTE declined by 13.4% from Summer Term 2006 to Summer Term 2007 and was down by 10.6% from summer Term 2004. FTE from college prep rebounded by 4.2% during Summer Term 2007 after dropping by 14.3% from Summer Term 2005 to Summer Term 2006.

PSAV rebounded from Summer Term 2006 by 45.7% and was down only 4.4% from Summer Term 2004.

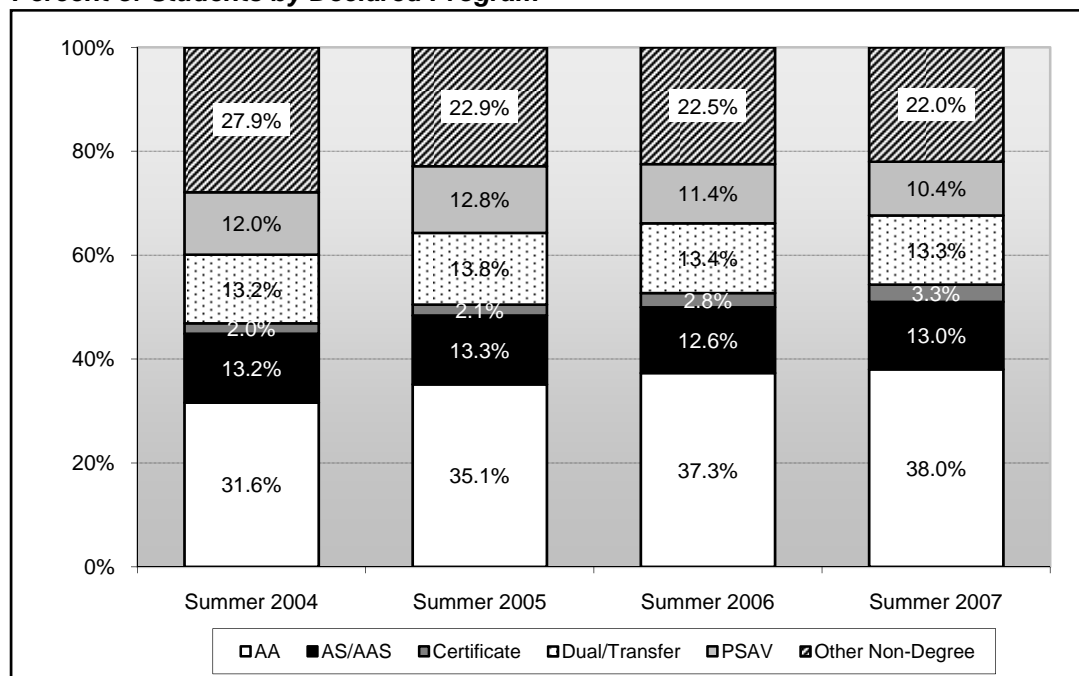
## **Declared Program**

Students pursuing an AA degree continued to comprise the largest single portion of the student body. The proportion of these students grew, however, as the number of students in other categories decreased. The category of students seeking AS/AAS degrees decreased by 12.7% from 2005 to 2006 and then rebounded by 4.2% in 2007, but was still 11.8% below 2004 levels. The category of students seeking PSAV certificates declined steadily since 2005, with a cumulative loss of 22.4% since 2004.

### ***Percent of Students by Declared Program<sup>1</sup>***



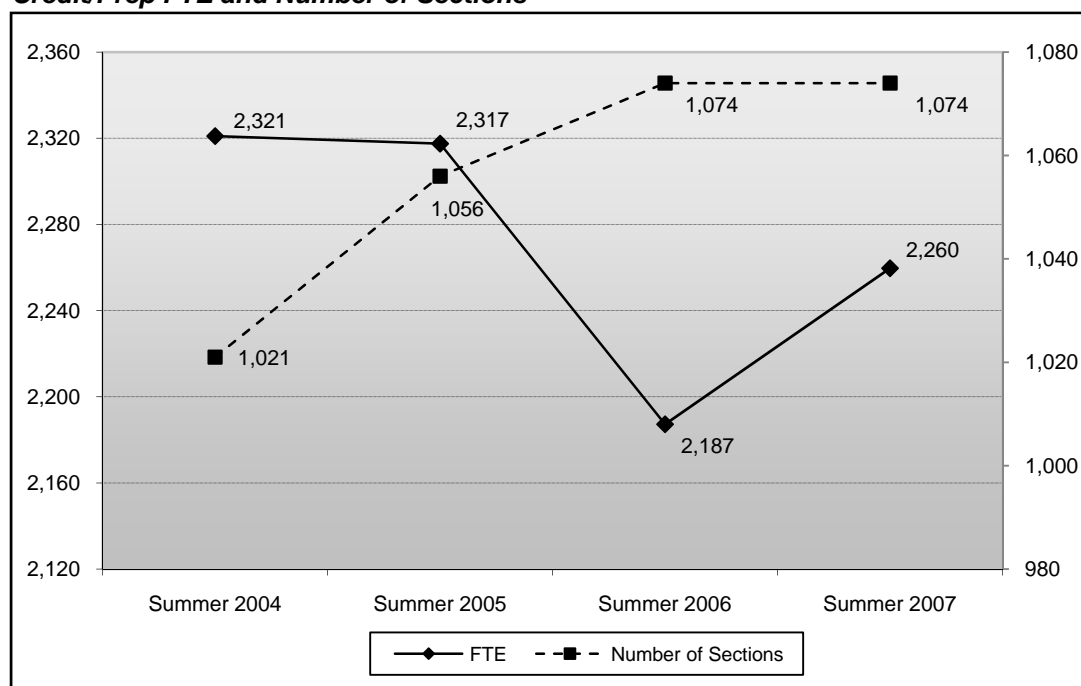

### Select Variables for Credit/Prep

The number of sections offered increased between Summer Terms 2005 and 2006 while FTE declined, resulting in a corresponding drop in seat occupancy. This trend improved in Summer Term 2007 when the number of sections offered remained stable and FTE increased.

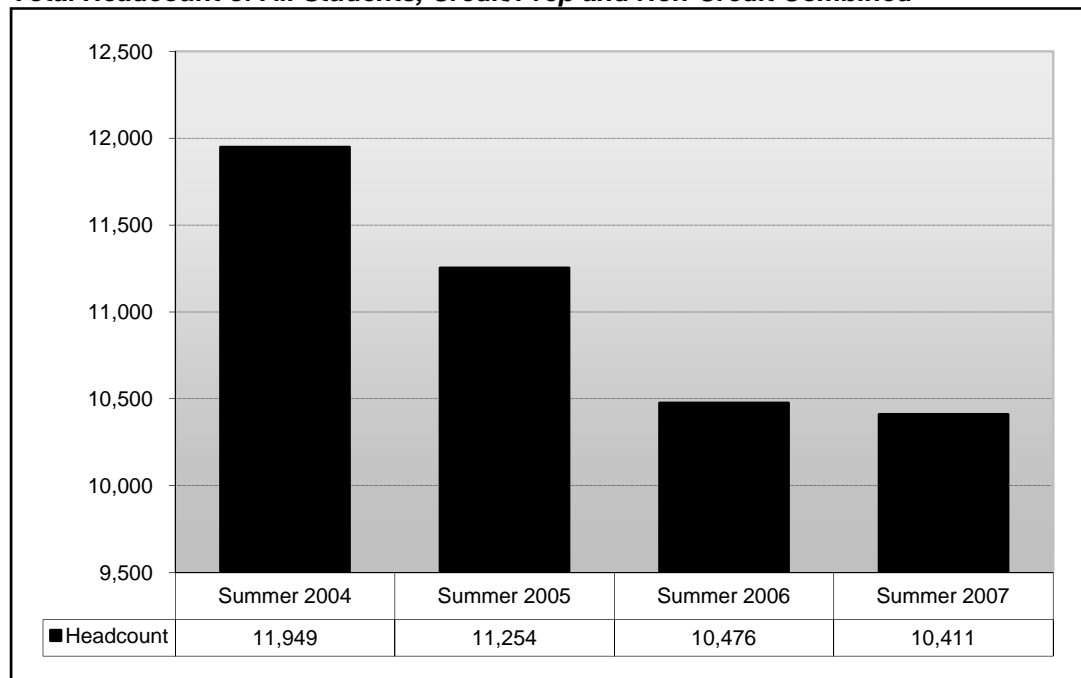

## PBCC at Lake Worth

### Headcount

Total headcount at PBCC at Lake Worth had been decreasing since 2004. Headcount dropped by 5.8% from Summer Term 2004 to Summer Term 2005 and 6.9% from Summer Term 2005 to Summer Term 2006. Total headcount leveled off during Summer Term 2007, dropping by less than 1.0%.

#### Total Headcount of All Students, Credit/Prep and Non-Credit Combined<sup>1</sup>

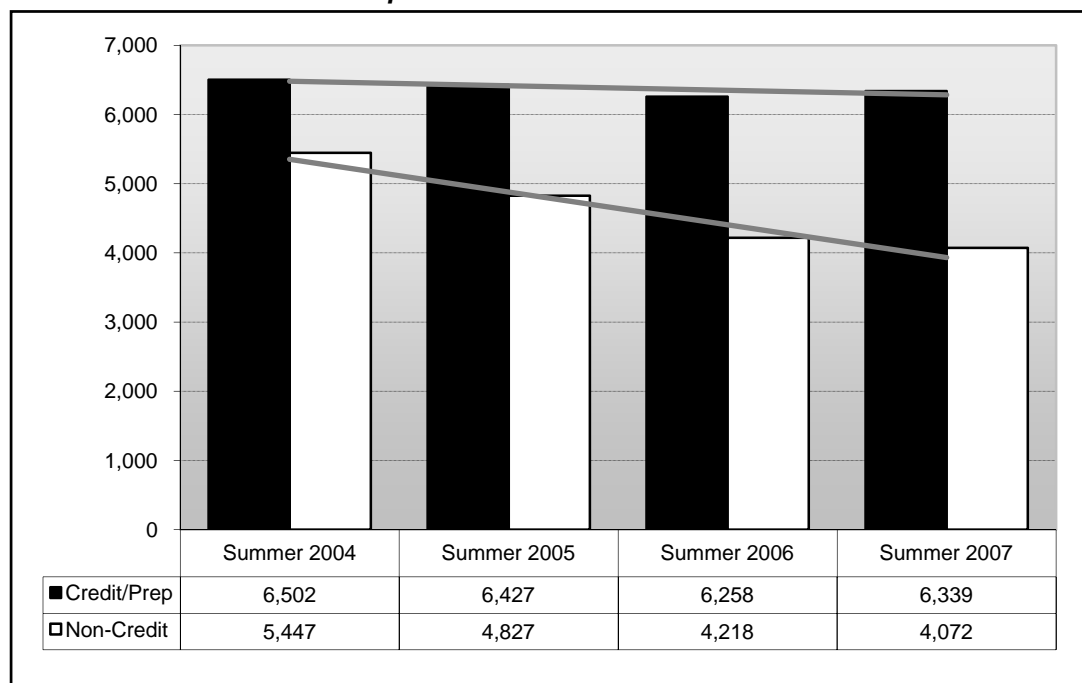
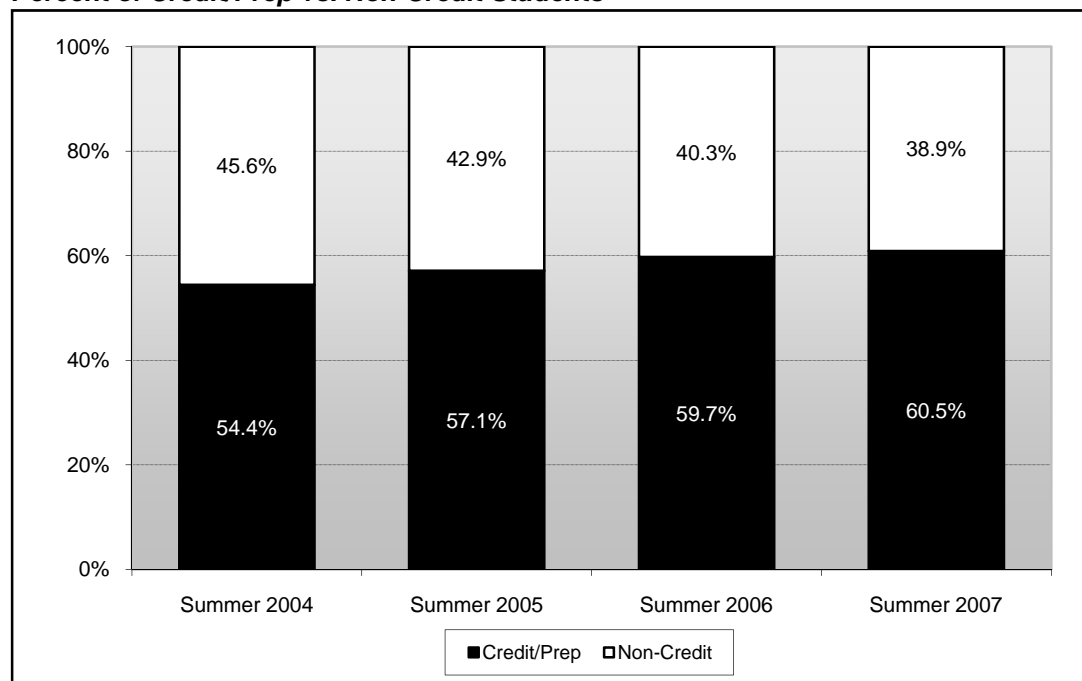


Headcount from students enrolled in credit/prep classes has remained fairly stable since 2004. Headcount from students enrolled in non-credit only classes steadily decreased during the same time period: 11.4% between 2004 and 2005, 12.6% between 2005 and 2006, and 3.5% between 2006 and 2007. As a result, the percentage of all students classified as credit/prep increased from 54.4% in 2004 to 60.5% in 2007. The proportion of non-credit only students decreased from 45.6% to 38.9% during the same time period.

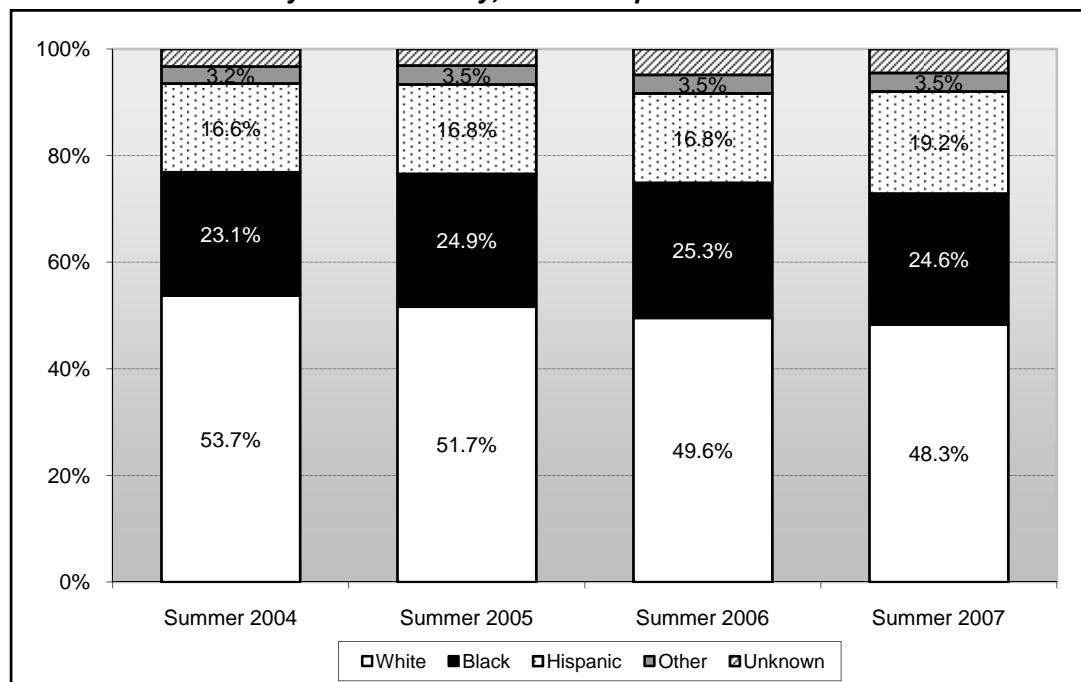
### Race/Ethnicity

The white non-Hispanic proportion of the student body at Lake Worth remained below 50.0%, declining 21.7% from Summer Term 2004. The number of Hispanic students increased the most during Summer Term 2007, growing by 13.5% from 2006 and comprising 19.2% of the total student body in 2007. The black student population continued to grow smaller and accounted for 24.6% of all students during Summer Term 2007.

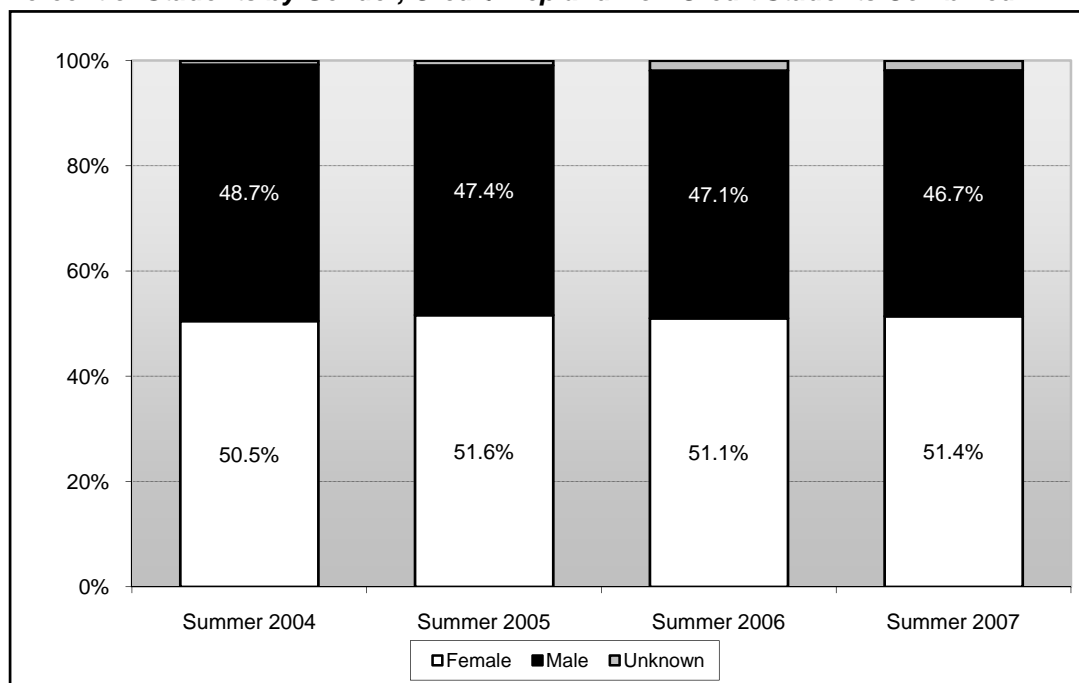
## Gender

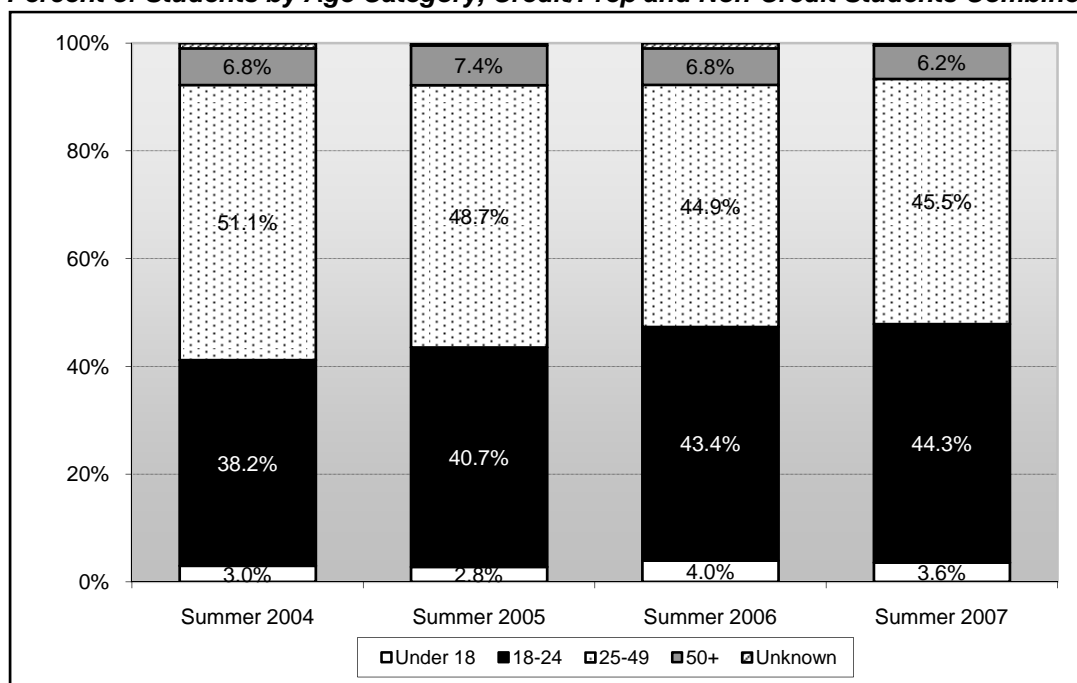
### Age

The student body has grown increasingly younger as fewer students over the age of 25 enrolled. Enrollment of 25-to-49 year-olds decreased 22.3% since 2004. The number of students over age 50 dropped by 20.8% between 2004 and 2007, while the number of students aged 18-to-24 remained fairly stable.

## **FTE**

FTE from credit/prep dropped in 2006, but rebounded somewhat in 2007. The current count is still 4.4% below 2004 levels.

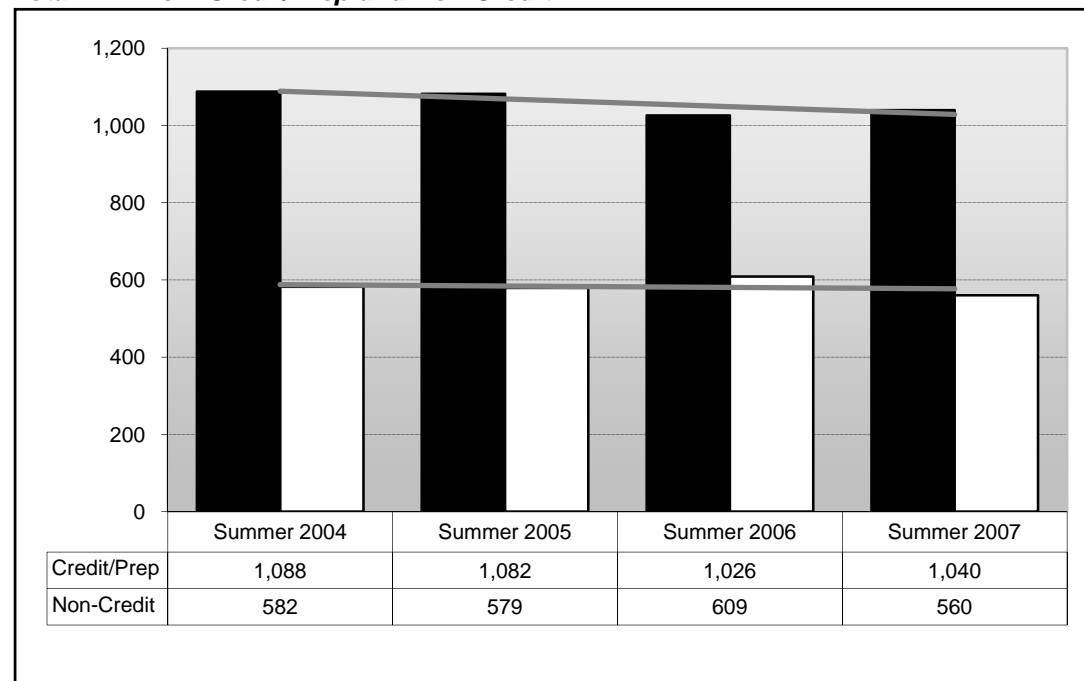
FTE from non-credit decreased every year except 2006, when apprenticeship programs peaked. PSAV, which steadily decreased between 2004 and 2006, increased by 33.5% from 2006 to 2007.

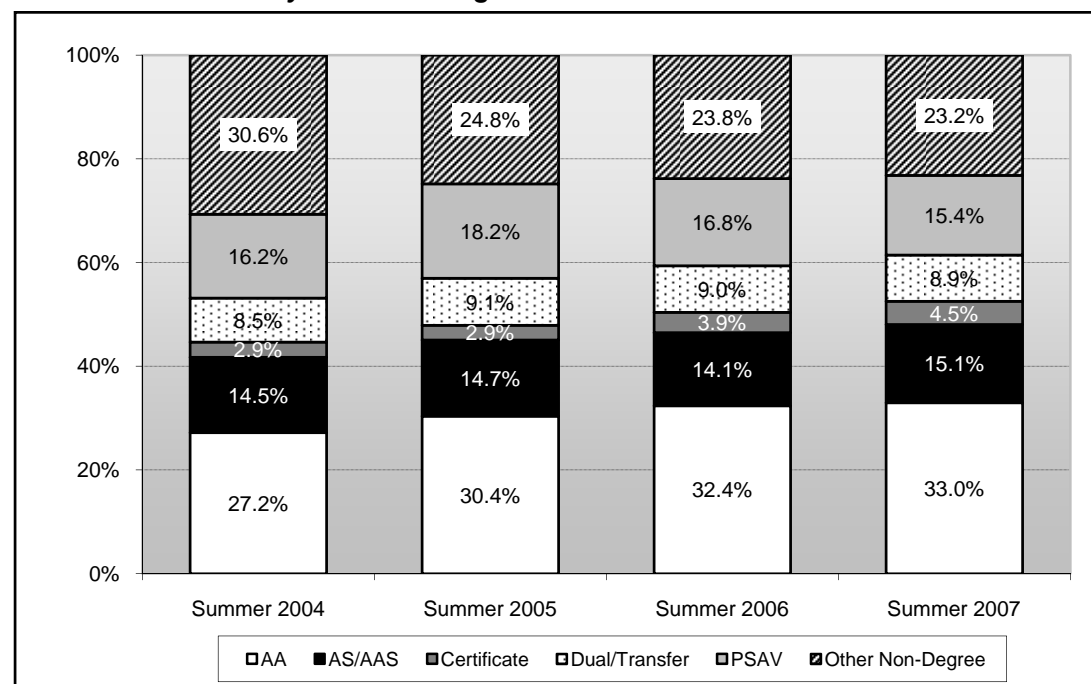
## Declared Program

The number of students pursuing an AA degree peaked in 2007 at 3,431, or one of every three students taking classes on the Lake Worth campus. The category of certificates, special diplomas and teacher prep steadily increased, due mainly to the addition of EPI. AS/AAS, which had been in decline for two years, increased 6.3% during Summer Term 2006, while PSAV and dual enrolled/transient categories continued their downward trends.

### Percent of Students by Declared Program<sup>1</sup>



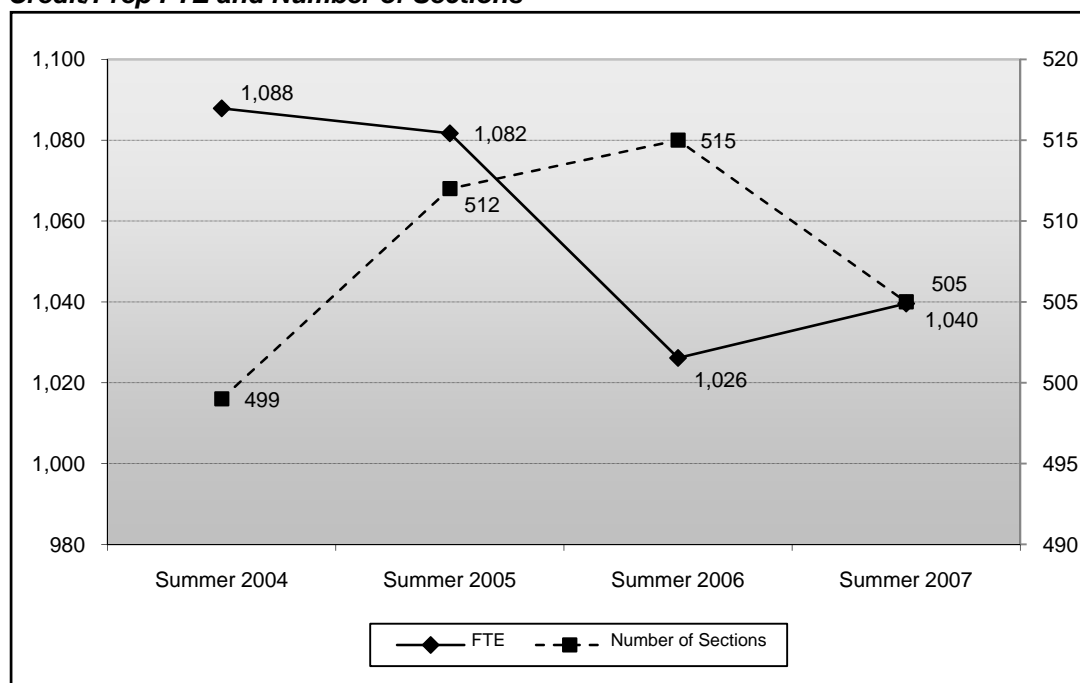

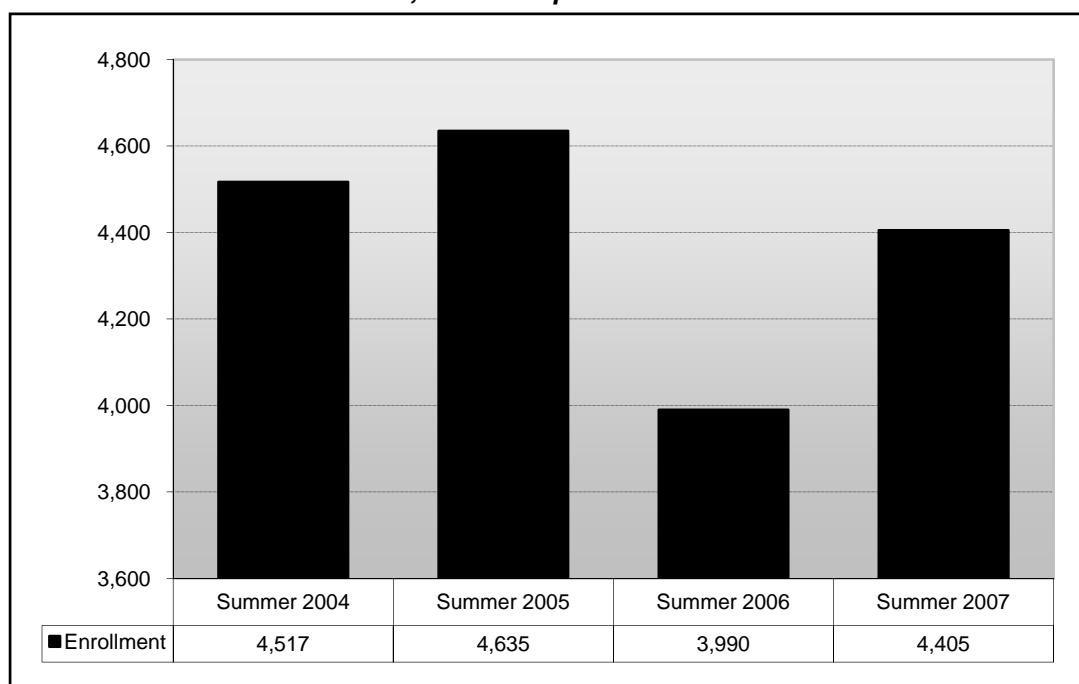

#### Total Headcount of All Students, Credit/Prep and Non-Credit Combined<sup>1</sup>

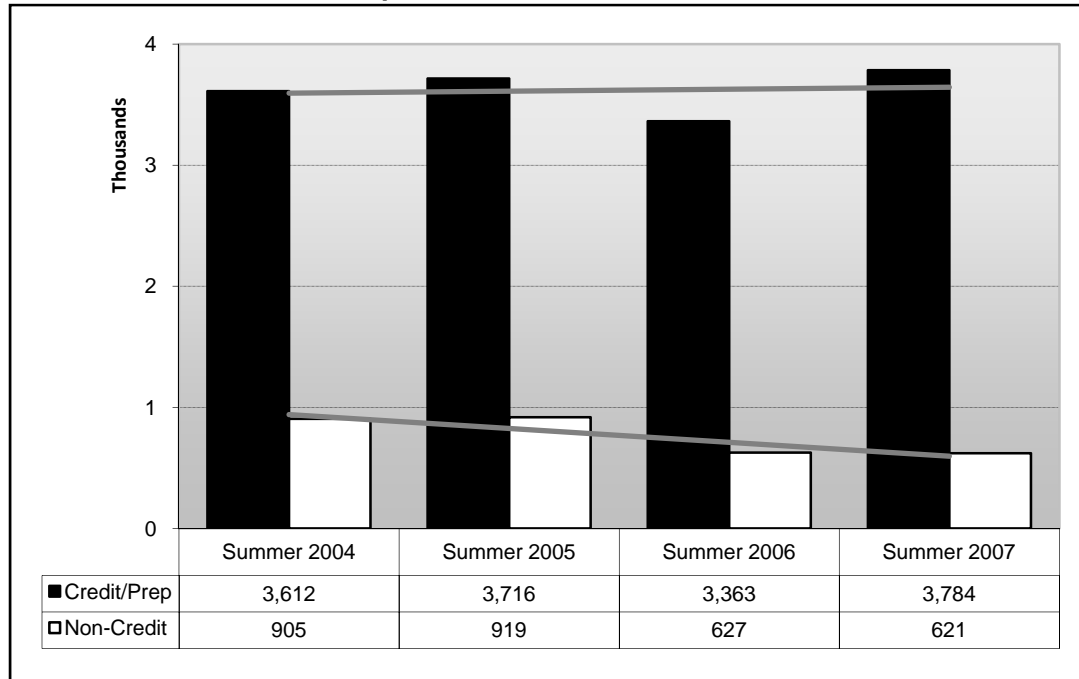
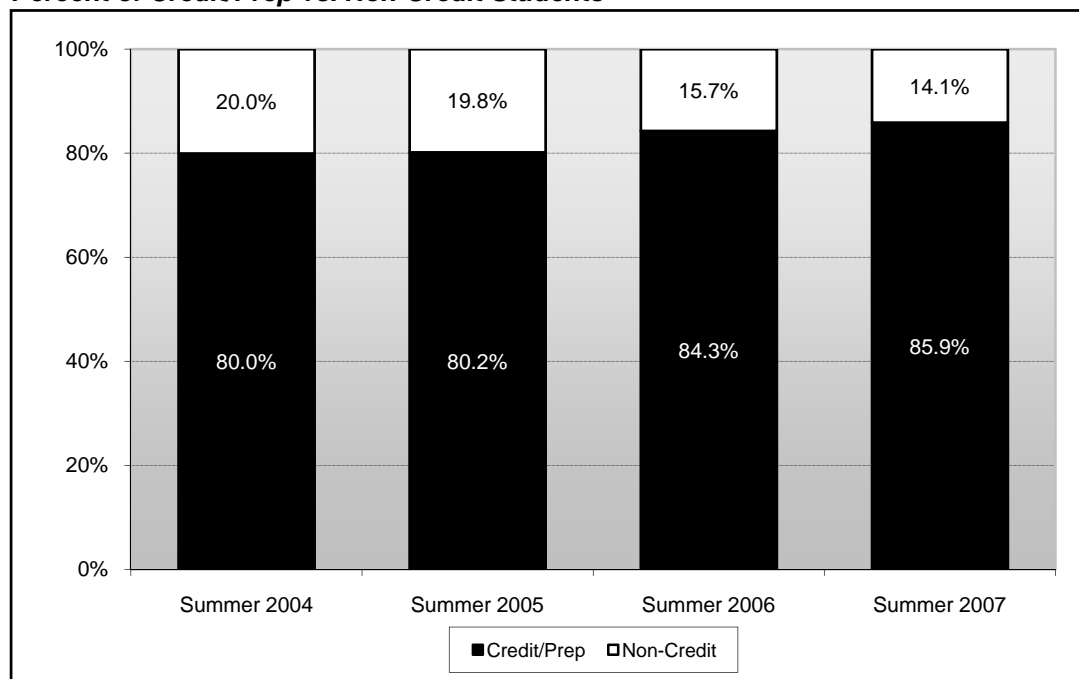

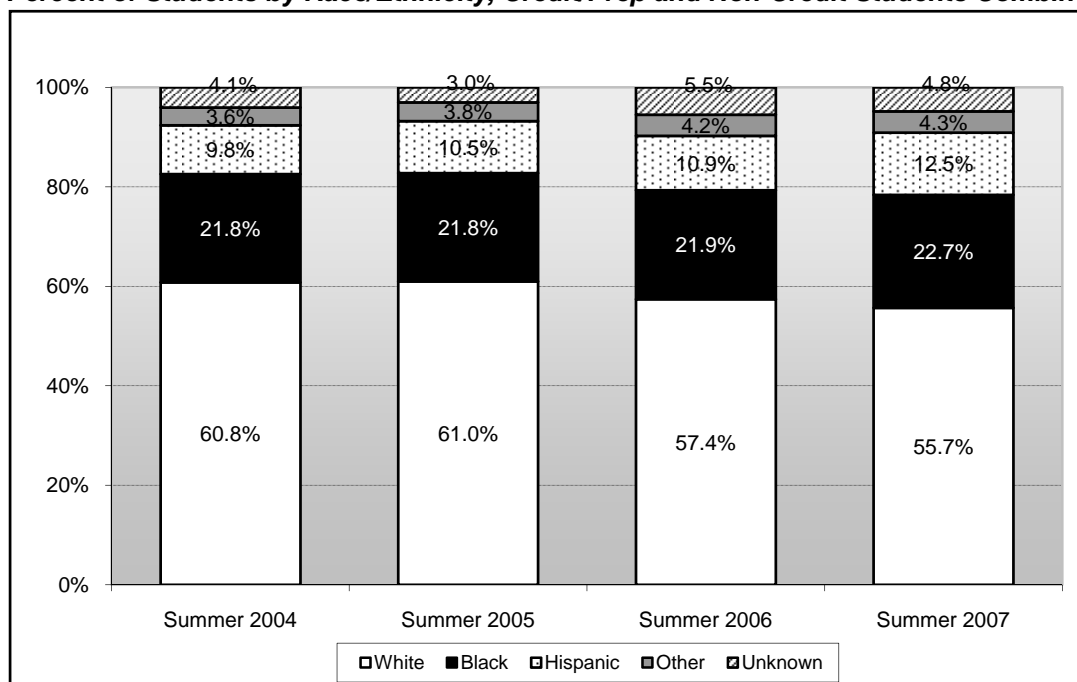
### Race/Ethnicity

The campus continued to diversify. The white non-Hispanic student population decreased from 60.8% of the total student body during Summer Term 2004 to 55.7% in 2007. The Hispanic student population increased from 9.8% in 2004 to 12.5% in 2007, and the black student population proportion increased slightly to 22.7%. Overall, the minority portion of students grew from 35.2% in 2004 to 39.5% in 2007.

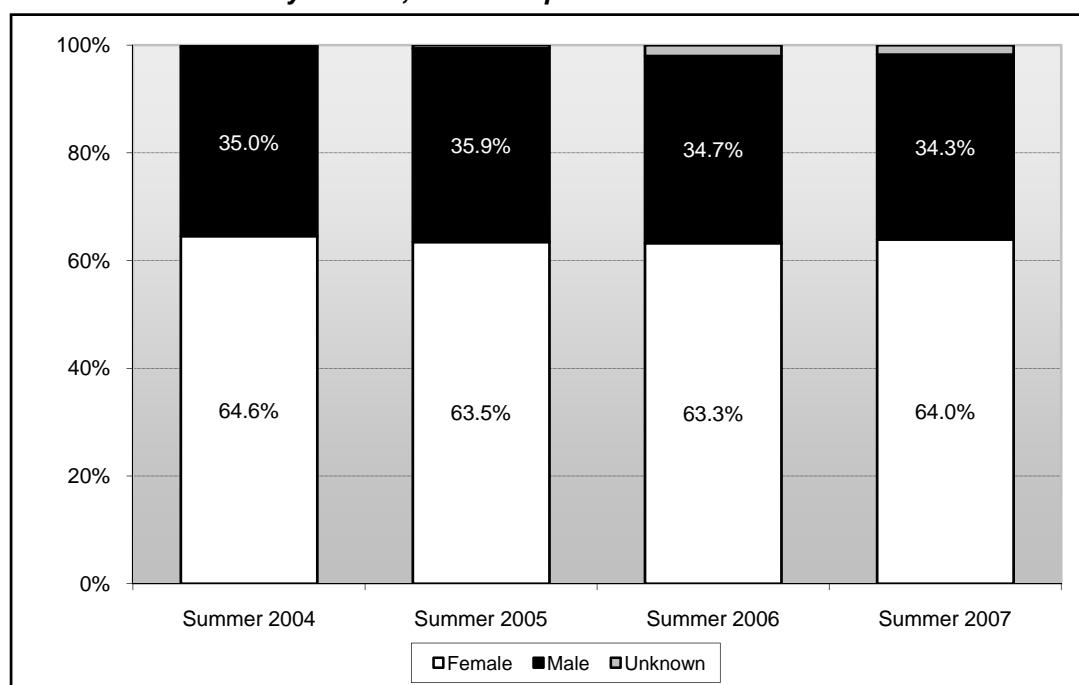
## Gender

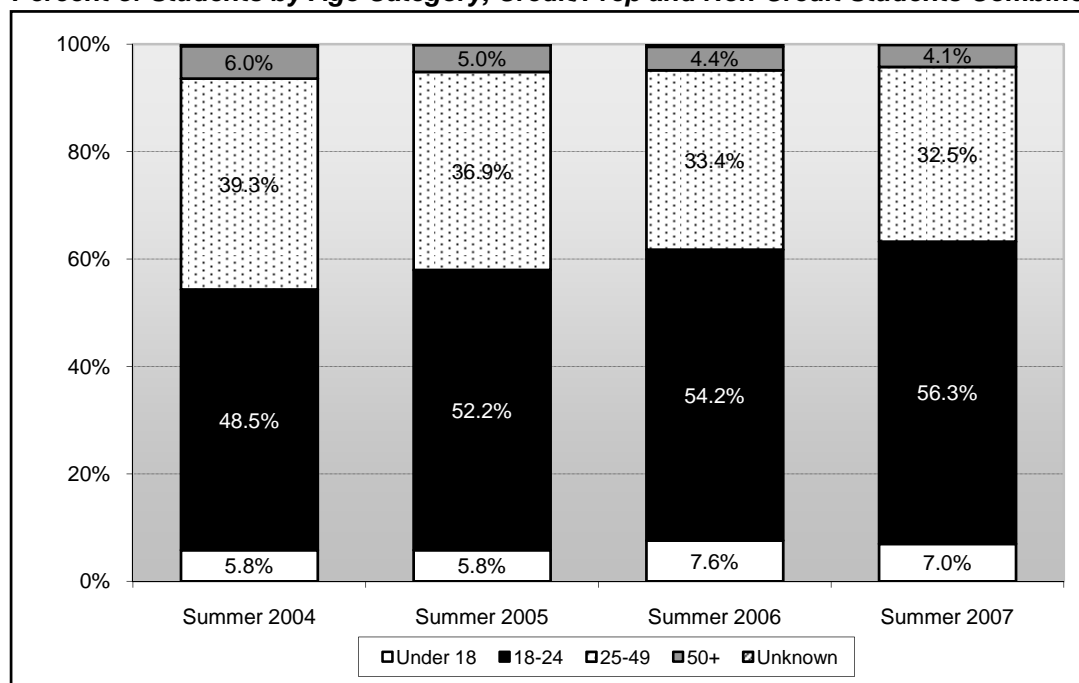

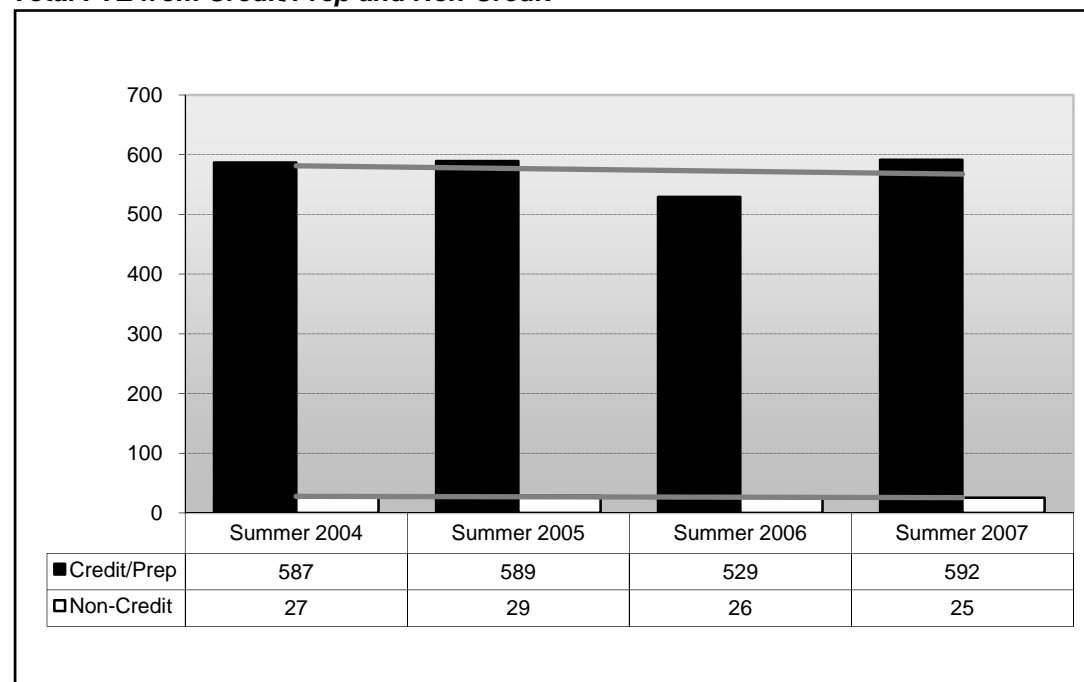

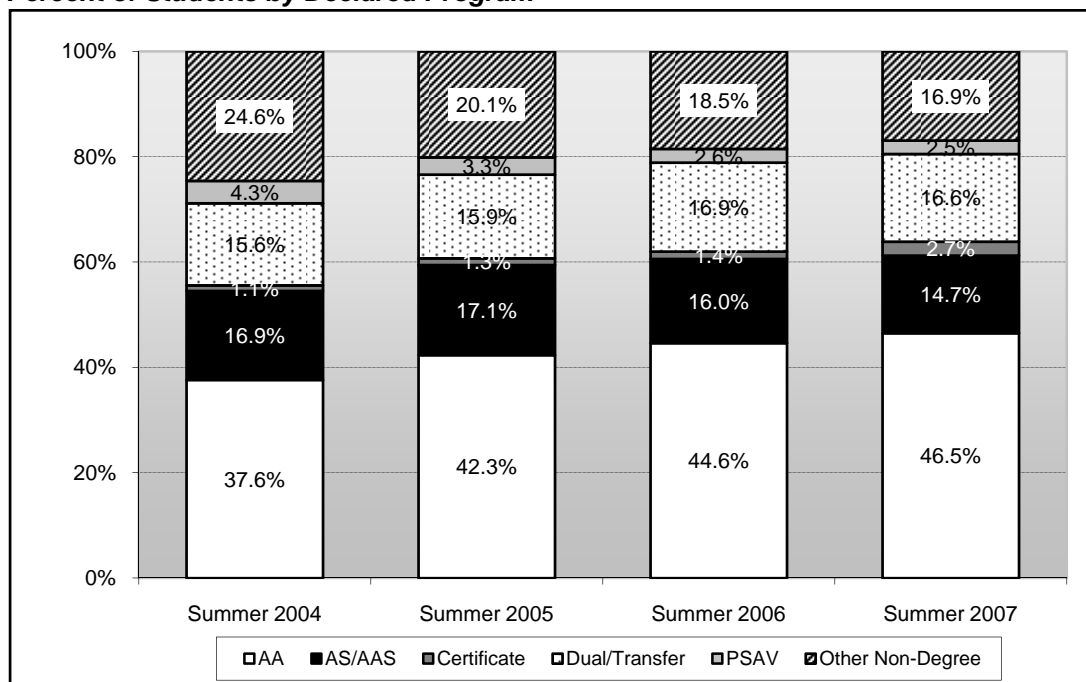

### Percent of Students by Declared Program<sup>1</sup>



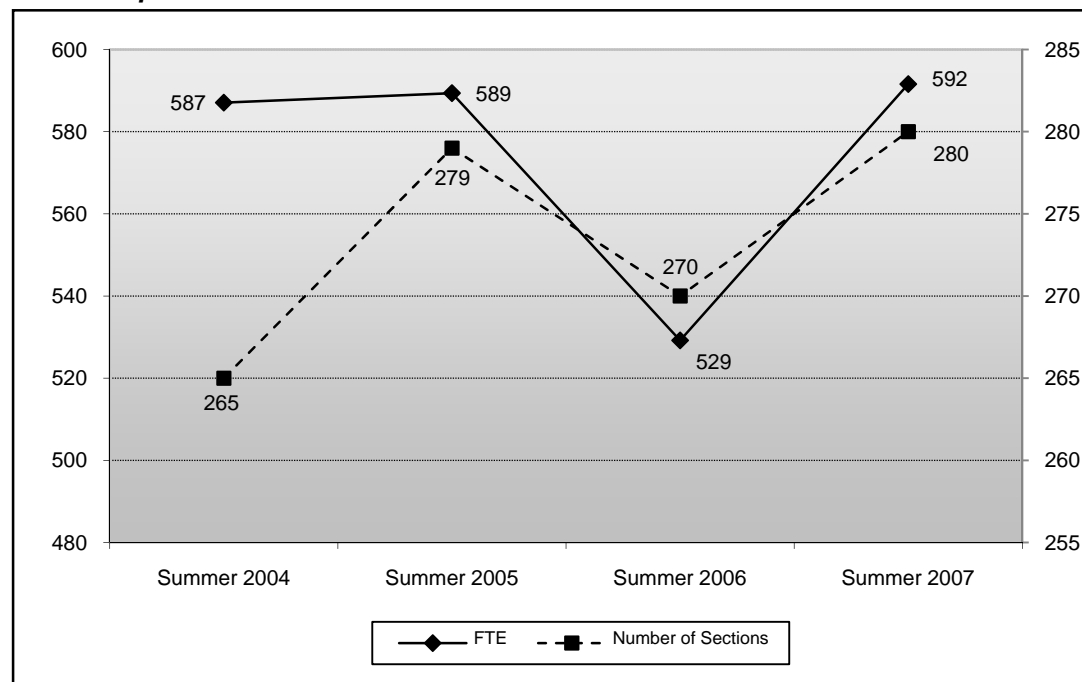

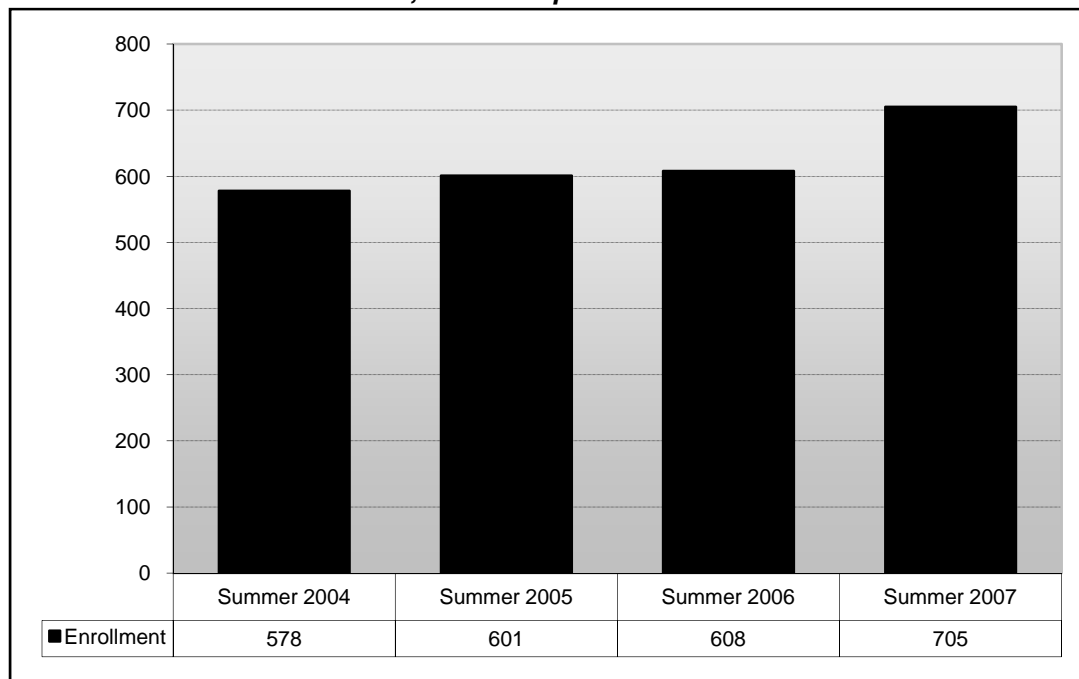

#### **Total Headcount of All Students, Credit/Prep and Non-Credit Combined<sup>1</sup>**

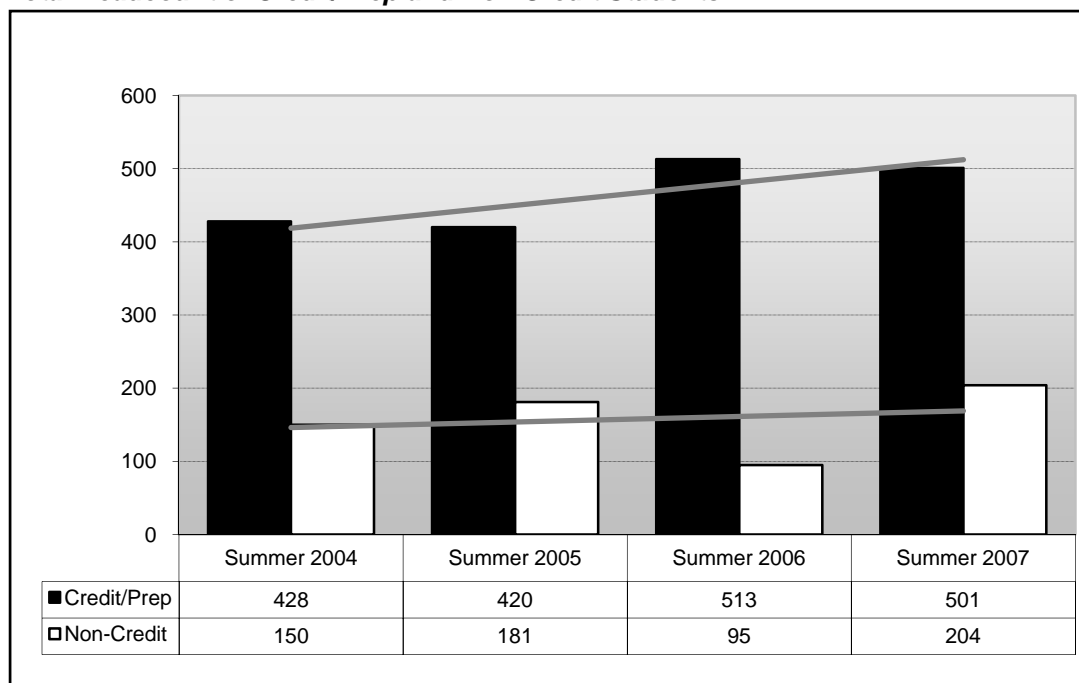
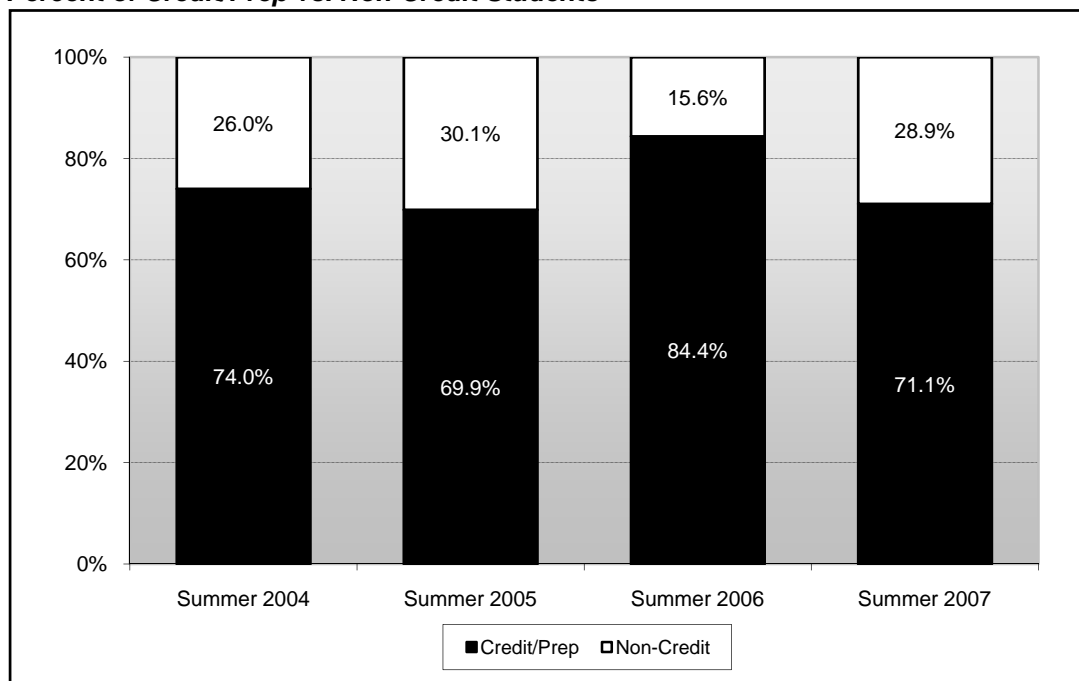

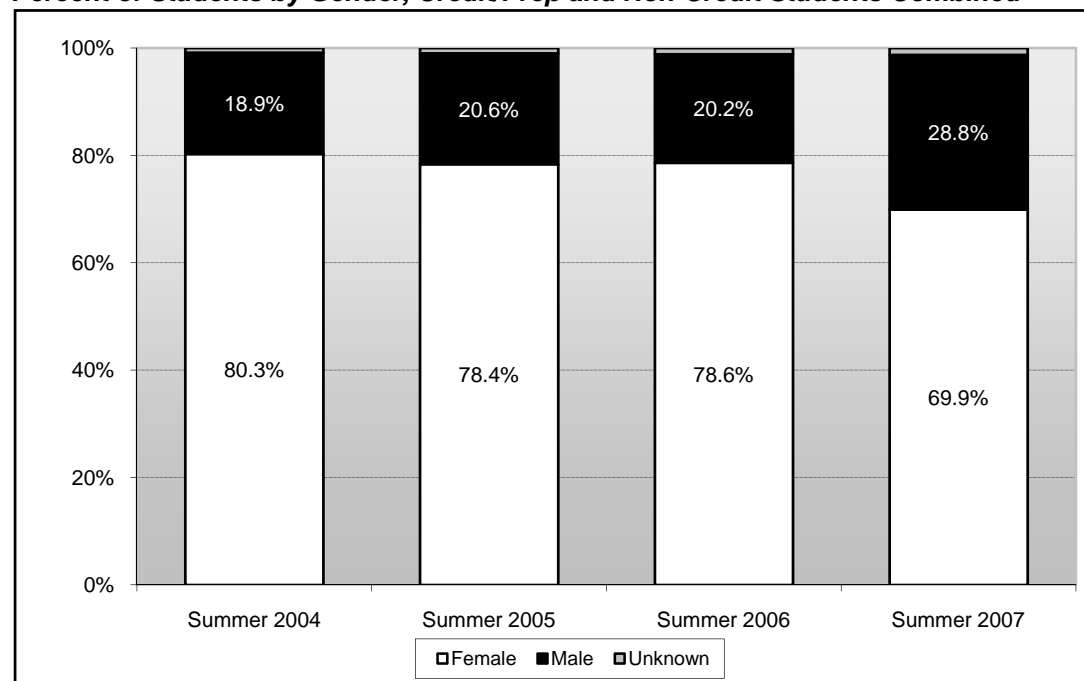

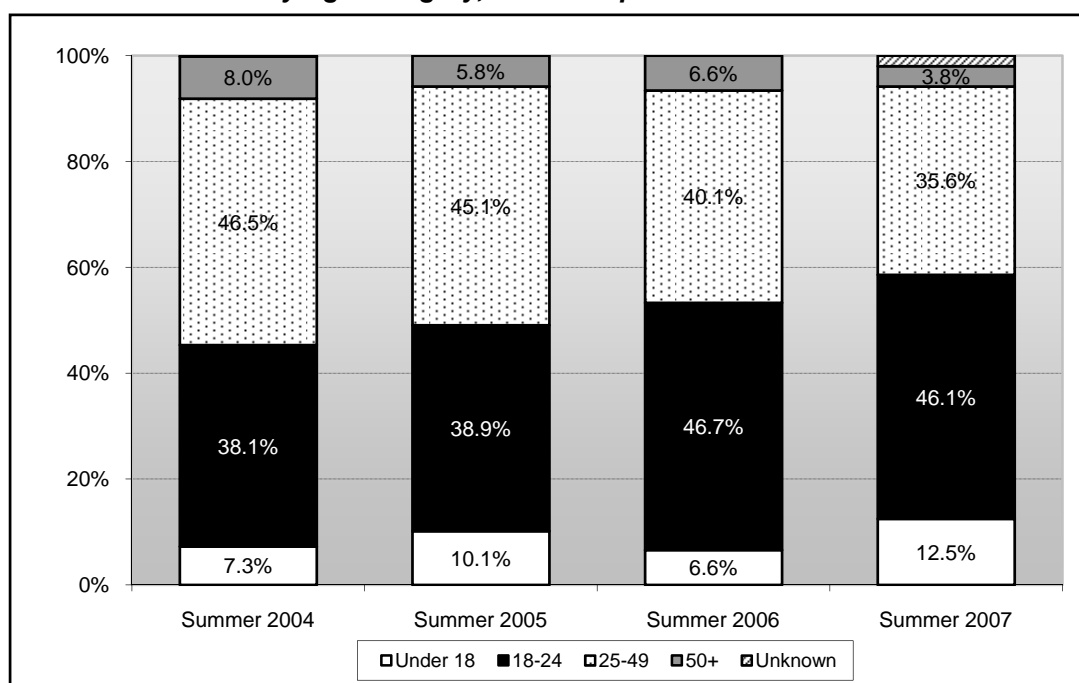

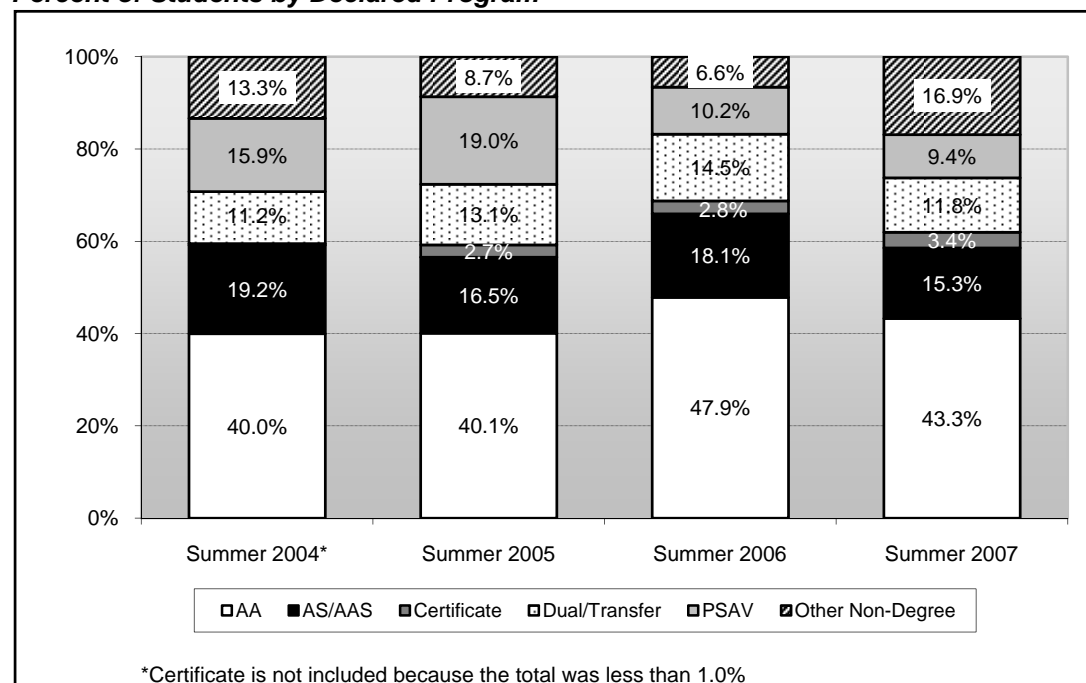

### Percent of Students by Declared Program<sup>1</sup>



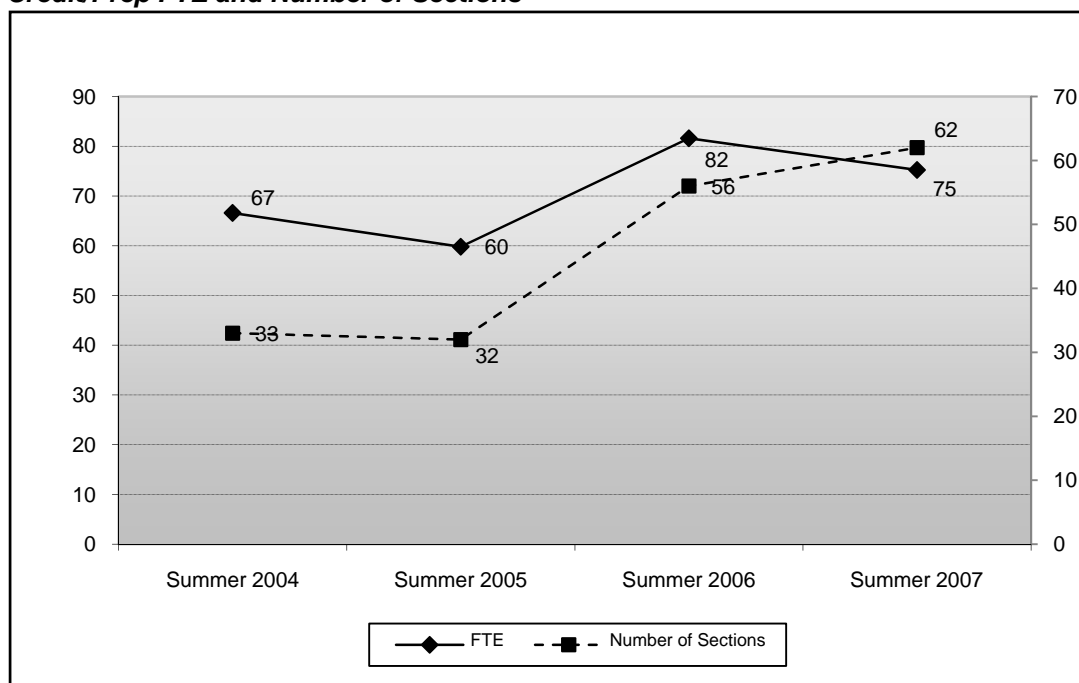

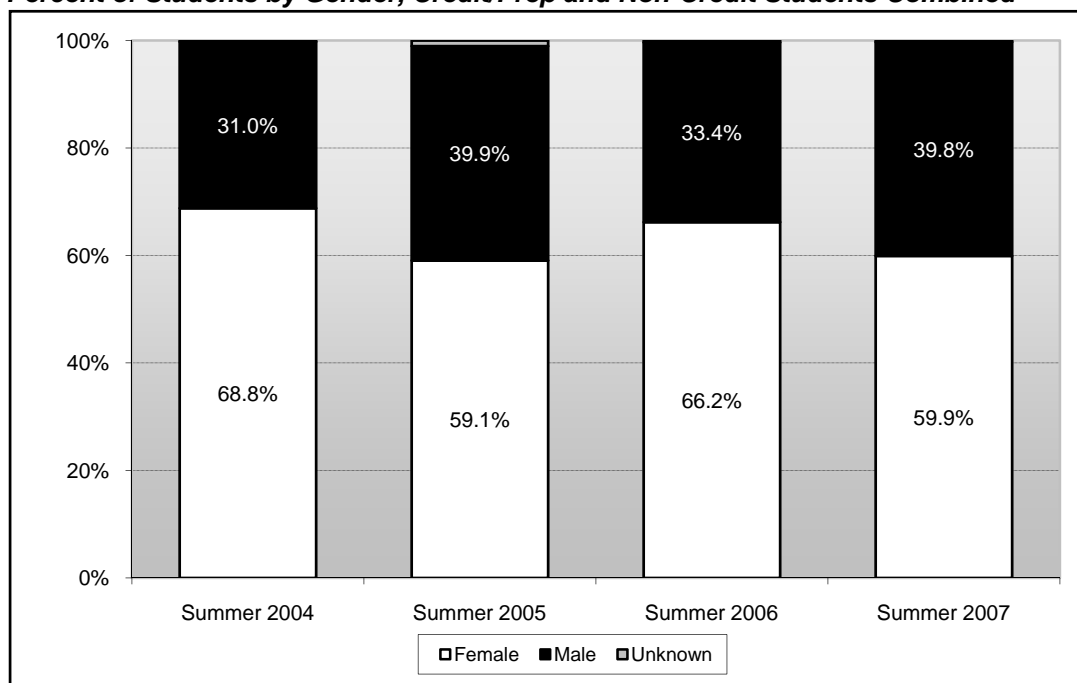

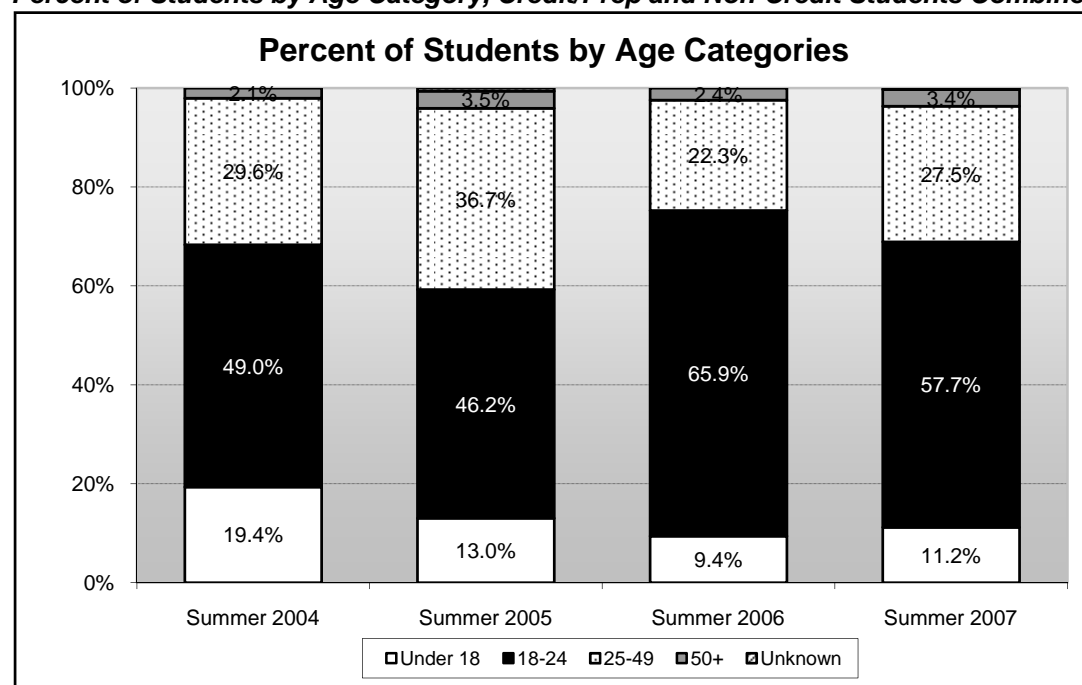

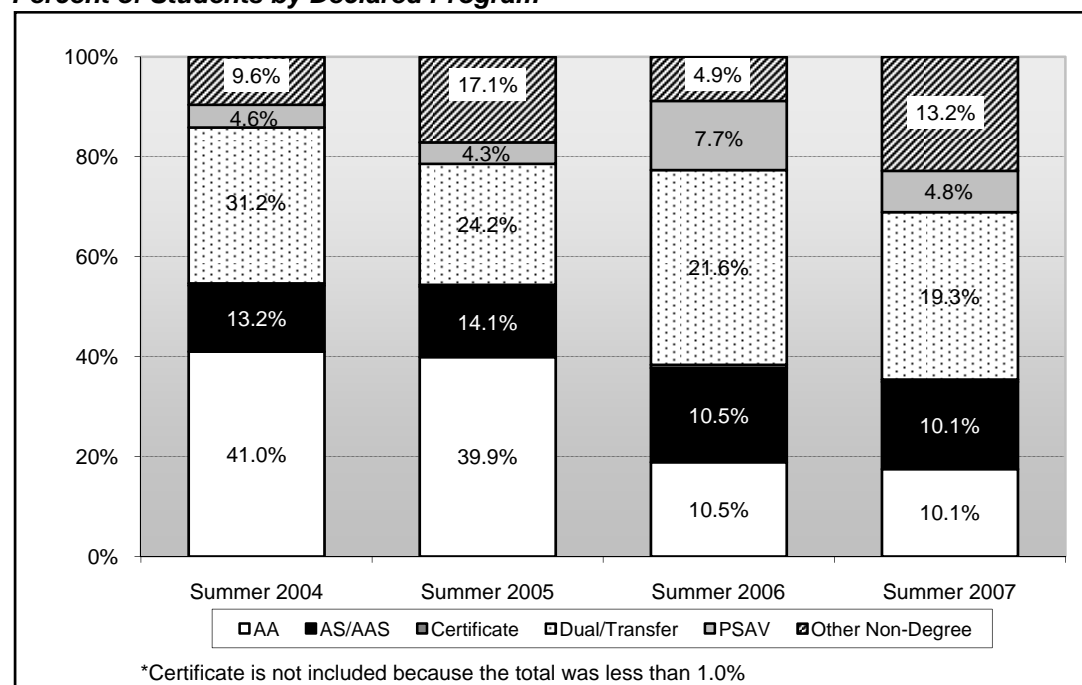

### Percent of Students by Declared Program<sup>1</sup>



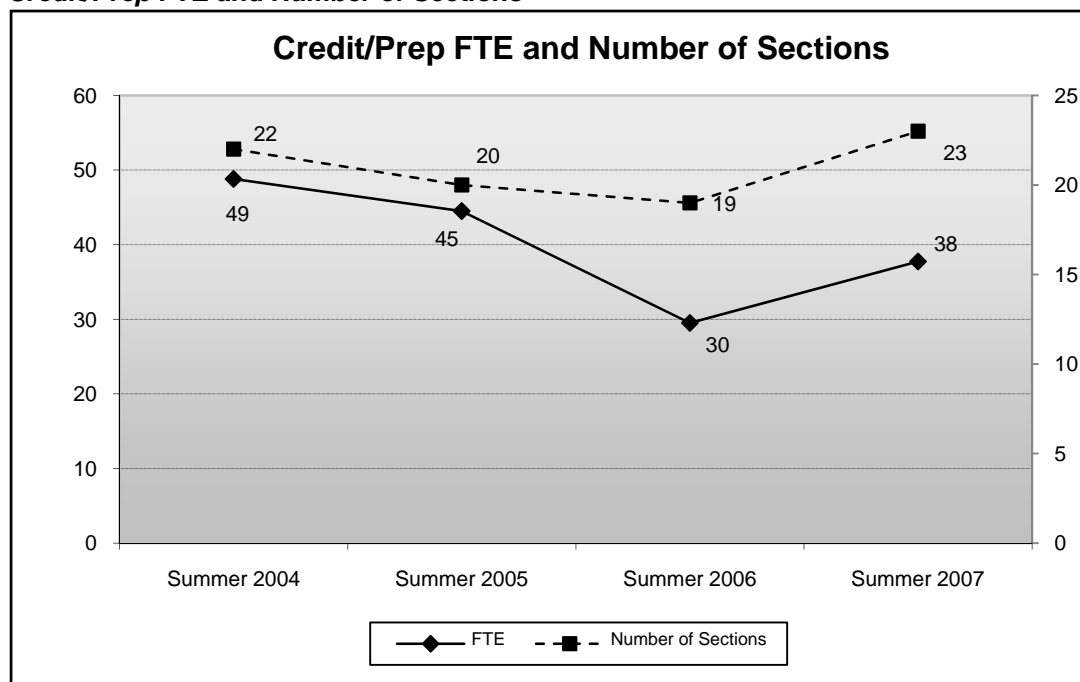

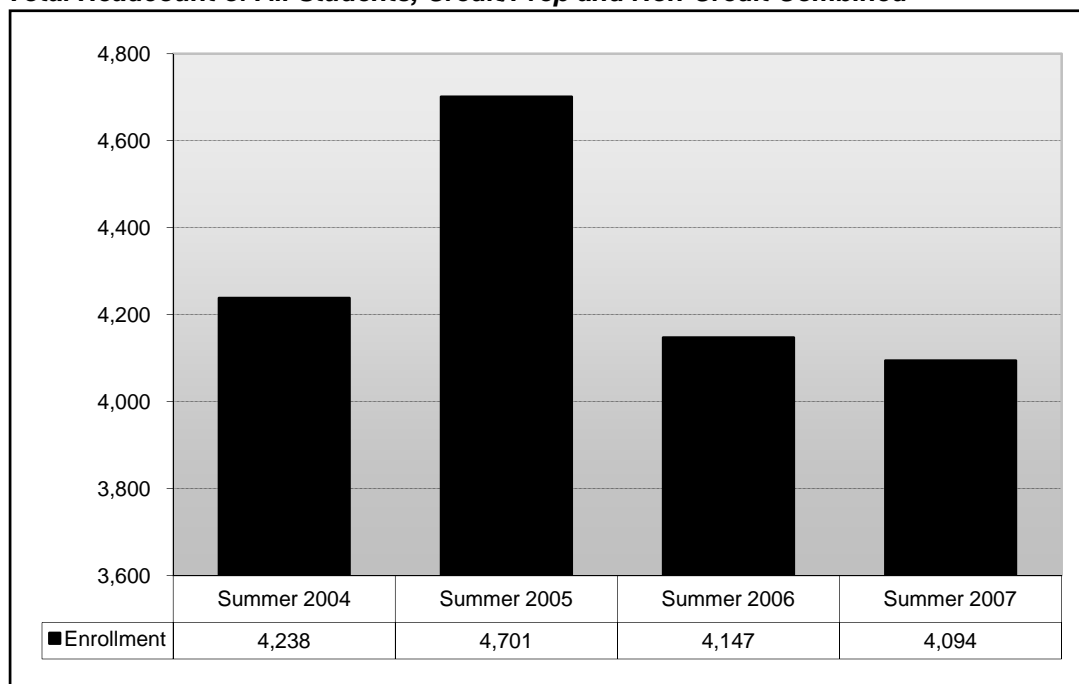

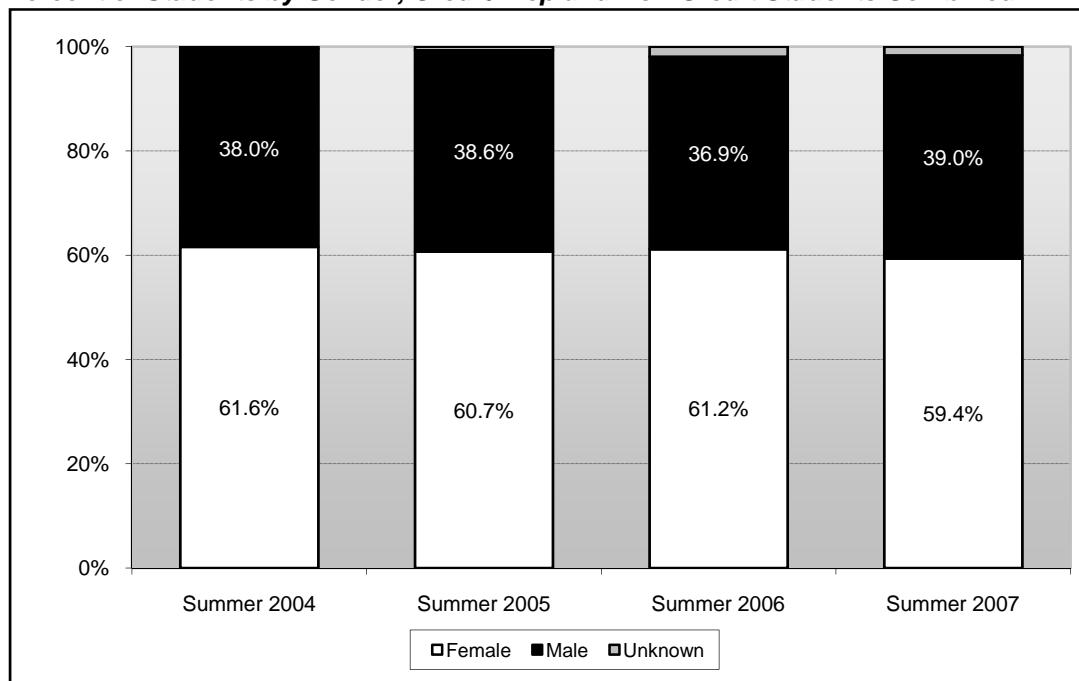

## **FTE**

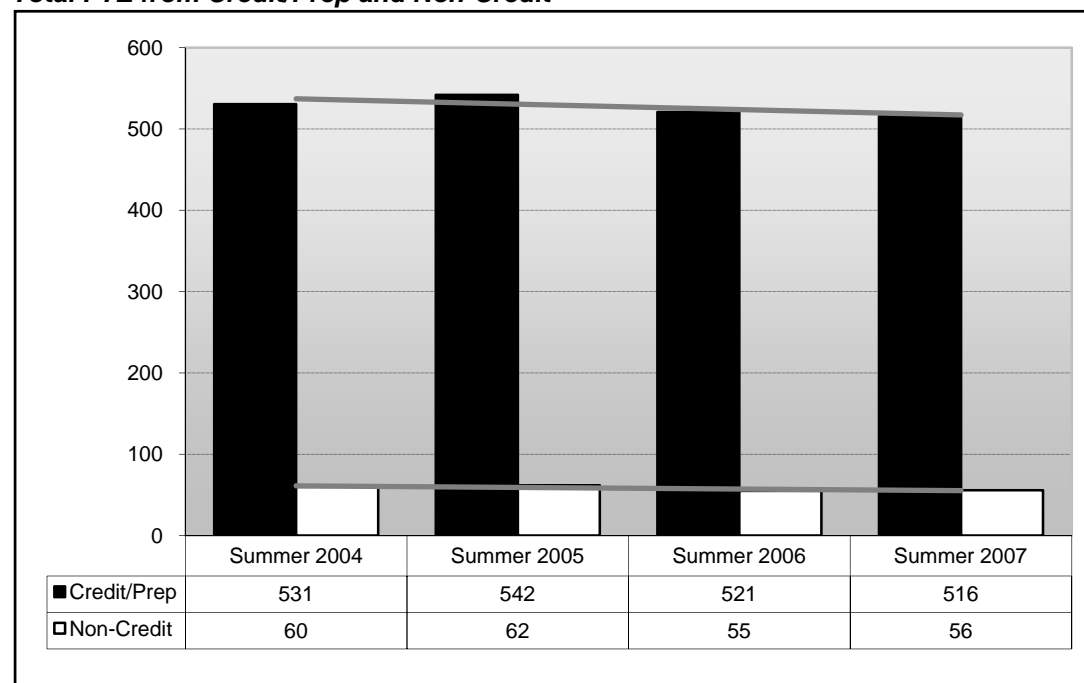

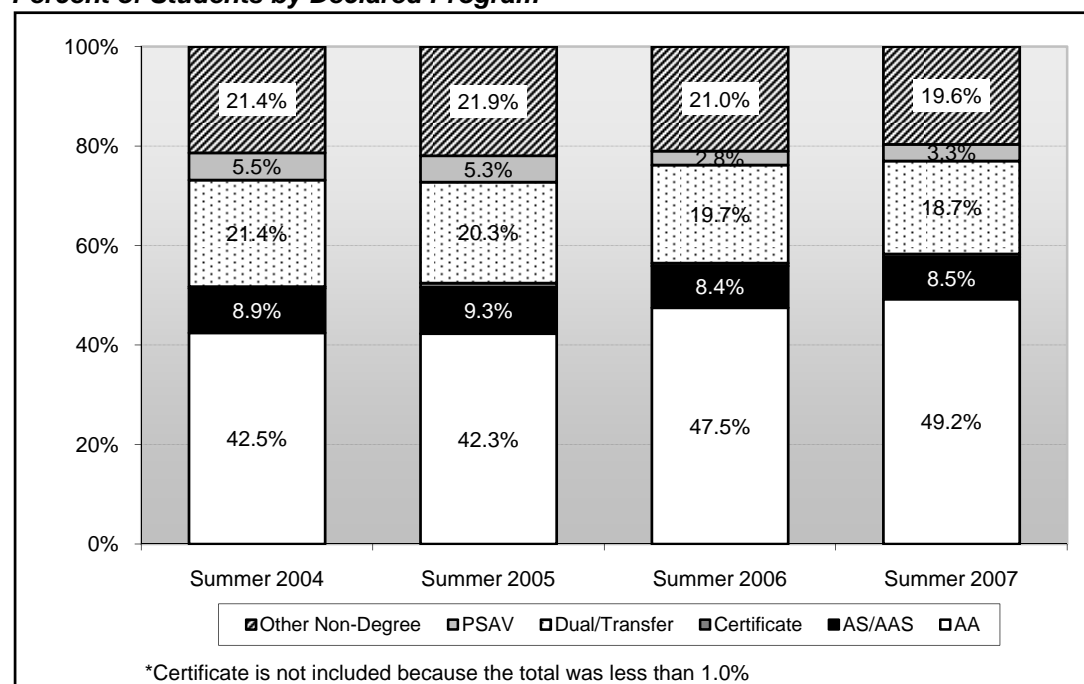
## Declared Program

### Percent of Students by Declared Program<sup>1</sup>



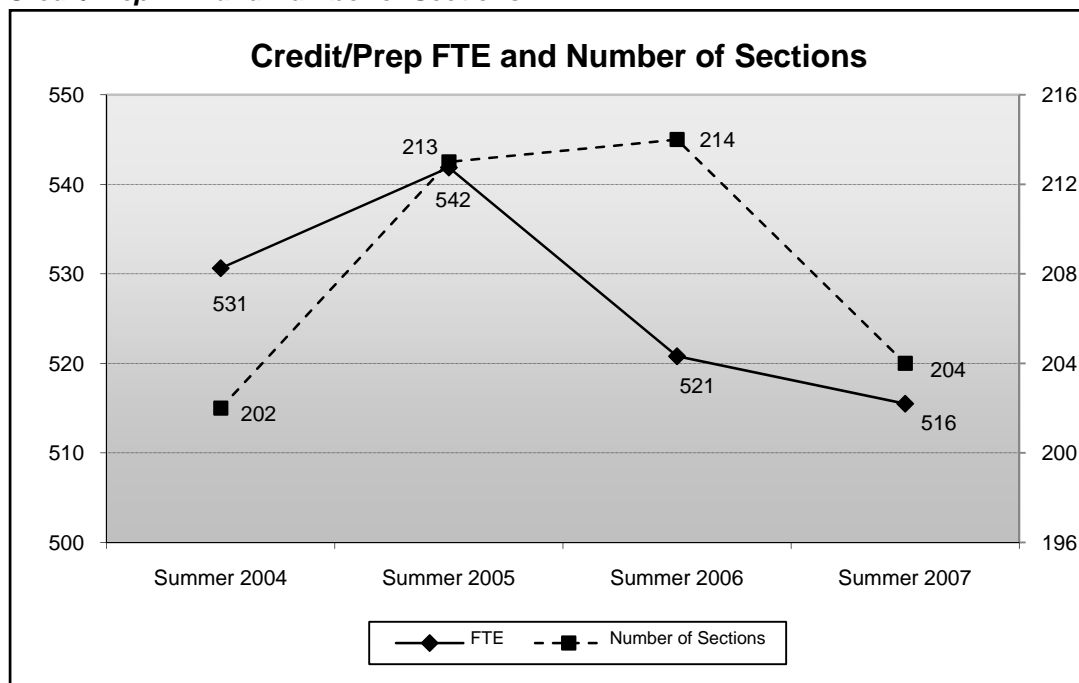
