Task Step/Sub-Tasks	Hazard(s)	Recommended PPE (Bolded)/Controls
1. Pick up litter, trash and other debris from ground or floor. See also JHA "Lift/Carry/Move Furniture, Boxes, Other Equipment, Objects and Materials".	Cuts/Penetration (from sharp objects placed in trash containers or trash bags)	Wear heavy duty or other cut-resistant work gloves . Use litter/trash pick-up tool.
	Ergonomics (back or other strain)	Lifting/Back Safety training Do stretching and warm-up exercises before starting work.
	Impact (from falling objects dropped onto foot)	Wear work shoes with a safety toe .
2. Deposit litter, trash and debris into trash collection bag or other receptacle.	Ergonomics (back or other strain)	Lifting/Back Safety training Do stretching and warm-up exercises before starting work.
	Impact (from falling objects dropped onto foot)	Wear work shoes with a safety toe .
3. Place trash collection bag/receptacle onto transport vehicle.	Ergonomics (back or other strain)	Lifting/Back Safety training Do stretching and warm-up exercises before starting work.
	Impact (from falling objects dropped onto foot)	Wear work shoes with a safety toe .
4. Drive transport vehicle to appropriate collection point.	Impact (from vehicle accident)	Wear seat belt and follow safe driving practices.

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5. Place trash collection bag/receptacle into dumpster for pick-up by SWA or contractor.	Ergonomics (back or other strain)	Lifting/Back Safety training Do stretching and warm-up exercises before starting work.
	Impact (from falling objects dropped onto foot)	Wear work shoes with a safety toe.

NOTE: Basic hazard categories include – **impact** (falling/flying objects, struck by), **falls from height**, **penetration** (sharp objects piercing foot/hand, other body parts), **compression** (roll-over or pinching), **cuts, burns, chemical exposure** (inhalation, ingestion, skin contact, eye contact or injection), **heat, extreme cold, harmful dust, noise, light (optical) radiation** (welding, brazing, cutting, furnaces, etc.), **ionizing radiation, non-ionizing (RF energy) radiation, electrical shock, ergonomics** (includes back strain or other strain due to lifting/stretching) and **biologic**.
